SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 7, 2021 Afterfeast of the Meeting in the Temple St. Parthenius, Bishop of Lampsacus

Saint Parthenius, Bishop of Lampsacus, was a native of the city of Melitoupolis (in northwestern Asia Minor), where his father Christopher served as deacon. The youth did not receive adequate schooling, but he learned the Holy Scripture by attending church services. He had a good heart, and distributed to the poor the money he earned working as a fisherman.

Filled with the grace of God, Saint Parthenius from age eighteen healed the sick in the name of Christ, cast out demons and worked other miracles. Learning of the young man's virtuous life, Bishop Philetus of Melitoupolis educated him and ordained him presbyter.

In 325, during the reign of Constantine the Great, Archbishop Achilles of Cyzicus made him bishop of the city of Lampsacus (Asia Minor). In the city were many pagans, and the saint fervently began to spread the faith in Christ, confirming it through many miracles and by healing the sick.

The people began to turn from their pagan beliefs, and the saint went to the emperor Constantine the Great seeking permission to tear down the pagan temple and build a Christian church in its place. The emperor received the saint with honor, gave him a decree authorizing the destruction of the pagan temple, and provided him with the means to build a church. Returning to Lampsacus, Saint Parthenius had the pagan temple torn down, and built a beautiful church of God in the city.

In one of the razed temples, he found a large marble slab which he thought would be very suitable as an altar. The saint ordered work to begin on the stone, and to move it to the church. Through the malice of the devil, who became enraged at the removal of the stone from the pagan temple, the cart overturned and killed the driver Eutychian. Saint Parthenius restored him to life by his prayer and shamed the devil, who wanted to frustrate the work of God.

The saint was so kind that he refused healing to no one who came to him, or who chanced to meet him by the wayside, whether he suffered from bodily illnesses or was tormented by unclean spirits. People even stopped going to physicians, since Saint Parthenius healed all the sick for free. With the great power of the name of Christ, the saint banished a host of demons from people, from their homes, and from the waters of the sea.

Once, the saint prepared to cast out a devil from a certain man, who had been possessed by it since childhood. The demon began to implore the saint not to do so. Saint Parthenius promised to give the evil spirit another man in whom he could

dwell. The demon asked, "Who is that man?" The saint replied, "You may dwell in me, if you wish."

The demon fled as if stung by fire, crying out, "If the mere sight of you is a torment to me, how can I dare to enter into you?"

An unclean spirit, cast out of the house where the imperial purple dye was prepared, said that a divine fire was pursuing him with the fire of Gehenna.

Having shown people the great power of faith in Christ, the saint converted a multitude of idol-worshippers to the true God.

Saint Parthenius died peacefully and was solemnly buried beside the cathedral church of Lampsacus, which he built.

Resurrection, tone 2:

Come, let us worship the <u>Word</u> of God begotten of the Father before all <u>ages</u>, and in<u>car</u>nate of the Virgin <u>Mary</u>! Having endured the Cross, He was buried as He him<u>self</u> desired.// And having risen from the dead, He saved me, the <u>erring</u> one.

Christ our Savior nailed to the Cross the bond against us, He voided it and destroyed the dominion of death.//
We fall down before His Resurrection on the third day.

With the Archangels let us praise the Resur<u>rec</u>tion of Christ! He is our Savior, our Re<u>deemer</u>. He is <u>coming</u> with awesome glory and mighty <u>power</u>// to judge the <u>world</u> which He made.

The Angel proclaimed You as the crucified and buried <u>Mas</u>ter. He told the women: "Come, see the <u>place</u> where He lay! He is <u>risen</u> as He said, for He is al<u>mighty</u>." We worship You, only im<u>mor</u>tal One.//
O Christ, the Giver of life, have <u>mer</u>cy on us!

Feast, tone 1:

<u>Sim</u>eon, tell us, Whom you <u>bear</u> in your arms, that you rejoice so greatly in the <u>Temple?</u> To <u>Whom</u> do you shout and <u>cry</u> aloud:

"Now I am set free, for I have <u>seen</u> my <u>Sav</u>ior?"
This is <u>He</u> Who was born of a <u>Virgin</u>;
this is God the Word, Who came <u>forth</u> from God,
Who for our <u>sakes</u> has taken flesh and has <u>saved</u> man.//
Let us <u>wor</u>ship Him!

Simeon, receive Him Whom Moses once beheld in darkness, granting the Law on Sinai, now that He has become a Babe subject to the Law! This is He Who spoke through the Law. This is He, of Whom the Prophets spoke, Who for our sakes has taken flesh and has saved man.// Let us worship Him!

<u>Come</u>, let us also go to meet Christ with di<u>vine</u> songs! Let us receive Him Whose salvation <u>Simeon saw!</u> This is <u>He</u> Whom <u>David announced</u>; this is He Who <u>spoke</u> in the <u>Prophets</u>, <u>Who</u>, for our sakes, has taken flesh and Who <u>speaks</u> through the Law.// Let us <u>wor</u>ship Him!

Saint Parthenius, tone 1:

The great Parthenius, the namesake of virginity, the beacon of Lampsacus, the radiant morning star of miracles, calleth us all together by his memorial, that we who sing hymns to Christ the Savior// may keep the spiritual feast.

You bore <u>God</u> within yourself from <u>child</u>hood by the fire of your prayers, O all-blessed and <u>wise</u> one. You <u>burned</u> up legions of <u>demons</u> and guided the <u>flock</u> of Lampsacus.
Casting <u>down</u> the temples of <u>idols</u>,//
you renewed your<u>self</u> for God.

The <u>fish</u> that was thrown away, breathless, yet life-<u>giv</u>ing; the fruit of the barren field and <u>vine</u>yard; the <u>gen</u>erous rain promised to <u>those</u> who wept, all pro<u>claimed</u> your <u>won</u>der.

Your <u>works</u> are wonderful, O celebrant of sacred <u>mys</u>teries.//
Therefore, pray that <u>we</u> may be saved.

Glory... for the feast, tone 6:

In the hands of the Elder up<u>on</u> this day You were pleased to be laid, O <u>Christ</u> our God, as upon the chariot of the Cherubim. Deliver us also, who <u>sing</u> Your praise, calling us back from the tyranny of the <u>pas</u>sions,// and save our souls!

Now & ever... the Dogmatkon in tone 2:

The shadow of the Law passed when <u>grace</u> came; as the Bush burned, yet was <u>not</u> consumed, so the <u>Virgin</u> gave birth, yet remained a <u>Virgin</u>.

Instead of a pillar of flame, the Righteous Sun has <u>risen.</u>// Instead of Moses, Christ, the Sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls.

APOSTIKHA: all stikhera of the Resurrection in tone 2:

Your Resurrection, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, has enlightened the whole <u>universe</u>, calling <u>back</u> Your creation.// Glory to You, O almighty Lord!

O Savior, by the Tree You destroyed the <u>curse</u> of the Tree. By Your burial You mortified the <u>majesty</u> of death. You have en<u>lightened</u> our race by Your Resur<u>rection</u>.// O Giver of life, Christ our God, <u>glory</u> to You!

O Christ, when You were seen <u>nailed</u> to the Cross, You restored the beauty of Your <u>crea</u>tures.

The <u>sol</u>diers showed their inhumanity when they pierced Your <u>side</u> with a spear. The Hebrews not knowing Your power asked that Your <u>tomb</u> might be sealed, but through the mercy of Your compassion, You accepted the tomb and rose on the <u>third</u> day!// O Lord, <u>glory</u> to You!

O Christ, the <u>Giver</u> of life, for the sake of the dead You voluntarily en<u>dured</u> death, de<u>scending</u> into hell as the <u>Mighty</u> One to save those who awaited Your <u>coming</u>, granting them the life of paradise in<u>stead</u> of hell. Grant <u>also</u> to us who glorify Your Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day// cleansing of our sins and great <u>mercy</u>!

Glory...now & ever... for the feast, tone 6:

Let the gate of heaven be opened today, for the unoriginate Word of the Father has made a beginning in time without forsaking His divinity. As a Babe forty days old, of His own will He is brought by the Virgin, His Mother, as an offering in the Temple of the Law. The Elder receives Him in his arms, crying as a servant to his Master: "Let me depart for my eyes have seen Your salvation!"// Glory to You, O Lord, for You have come into the world to save mankind.
