# SUNDAY, JANUARY 3, 2021 Sunday before the Theophany, Forefeast of the Theophany Holy Prophet Malachi

Chronologically, Malachi was the last of the prophets. He was born after the return of the Hebrews from the Babylonian Captivity in 538 B.C. He was unusually handsome in countenance. According to tradition, the people called him an angel, perhaps because of his external beauty or because of his spiritual purity, or even perhaps because of his association with an angel of God. On many occasions he spoke face to face with an angel. When this occurred, others heard the angel's voice, but they were not worthy to see the face of the angel. The young Malachi prophesied that which the angel proclaimed. He cried out against ungrateful Israel and against the lawless priests. Five hundred years before Christ, Malachi clearly prophesied the coming and the mission of John the Baptist: *Lo, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me* (Malachi 3:7). Mainly, he is chiefly the prophet of the day of the Dreadful Judgment. *Before the day of the Lord comes, the great and terrible day* (Malachi 3: 23-24). He reposed in the Lord while still young. Following him, there were no more prophets in Israel until John the Baptist.

### **GREAT VESPERS**

# LORD I CALL: Four stikhera of the Resurrection in tone 5 followed by three of the Forefeast, and three for the prophet.

## Resurrection, tone 5:

By Your precious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, You have put the <u>dev</u>il to shame. By Your Resur<u>rection</u>, You have blunted the <u>sting</u> of sin and <u>saved</u> us from the <u>gates</u> of death.// We glorify You, O only begotten One.

Christ was led as a sheep to the slaughter in order to grant Resurrection to the human race. The princes of hell were frightened by this, for the gates of sorrow were lifted. Christ the King of glory had entered, saying to those in chains: "Go forth!"//
And to those in darkness: "Come to the light!"

# O great wonder!

The Creator of the invisible suffered in the flesh in His <u>love</u> for man and <u>rose</u> again im<u>mortal</u>.

<u>Come</u>, O sons of <u>nations</u>, let us <u>wor</u>ship Him,

for de<u>liv</u>ered from error by His compassion,// we have learned to sing of one <u>God</u> in three <u>Persons!</u>

We <u>offer</u> You our evening <u>wor</u>ship,
O never <u>set</u>ting Light,
Who <u>came</u> in these last days to the <u>world</u> in the flesh;
Who <u>even</u> descended to hell to dispel its <u>darkness</u>.
Who has revealed the light of Resurrection to the <u>na</u>tions.//
Glory to You, O <u>Lord</u> and <u>Giver</u> of light!

## Forefeast, tone 6:

Behold the Enlightenment of the <u>faithful!</u> See, our Atonement desires to enter the streams of the <u>river</u>, that He may wash away man's filth and cor<u>ruption</u>,// refashioning us, who had been broken to <u>pieces!</u>

O Lord, Your Forerunner cried <u>out</u> in fear, when he saw You approaching and asking to be <u>bap</u>tized: "O my God! My Creator!//
How can I baptize You, the <u>sin</u>less One?"

O faithful, let us assemble in <u>spir</u>it at the streams of <u>Jor</u>dan, that we may clearly behold the great <u>won</u>der! We shall see the Creator of all made <u>man</u>ifest,// as He comes to be <u>bap</u>tized.

## Prophet Malachi, tone 8:

Beholding the words that came forth from your divinely-inspired tongue, truly marveling, I bless you, O Prophet of truth, for your clear message has illumined the world,// foretelling the coming of the Lord for our salvation.

You were an <u>angel</u> on earth, emulating the Angels with your <u>way</u> of life. You were enriched by appropriately bearing the <u>name</u> of <u>Angel</u>,\* and harmoniously you joined beauty of soul with beauty of <u>body</u>,// O most blessed Malachi.

O <u>Lord</u>, I set before You Your <u>Proph</u>et as an advocate and inter<u>ces</u>sor. By his entreaties and <u>prayers</u>, O Compassionate One,

put an end to the misdeeds of my despairing soul, for You are full of loving-kindness,// as You possess essential and natural goodness.

# Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; Forefeast, tone 4:

Oh, the marvelous <u>won</u>der!
He Who baptizes by the Holy <u>Spir</u>it and by fire <u>comes</u> to be baptized by John in the <u>Jor</u>dan.
Neither simply God nor <u>plainly</u> man, but, in both His natures, He is one <u>only-begot</u>ten Son. In His humanity, He asks a servant to <u>baptize</u> Him; in His divinity, He takes away the <u>sins</u> of the world// granting great mercy to all.

# now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. the Dogmatikon in tone 5:

In the Red Sea of old, a type of the Virgin Bride was prefigured. There Moses divided the waters; here Gabriel assisted in the miracle. There Israel crossed the sea without getting wet, here the Virgin gave birth to Christ without seed. After Israel's passage, the sea remained impassable; after Emmanuel's birth, the Virgin remained a Virgin. O ever-existing God Who appeared as Man,// O Lord, have mercy on us!

# APOSTIKHA: All stikhera of the Resurrection in tone 5:

We <u>magnify</u> You in <u>songs</u> of praise,
O incarnate Christ and <u>Sav</u>ior.
By accepting the Cross and <u>death</u> for our sake,
as the <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lov</u>er of man,
You overthrew the <u>gates</u> of hell,//
and arose on the <u>third</u> day, <u>sav</u>ing our souls.

By being <u>pierced</u> in the side, O <u>Lover</u> of man, You have poured out drops of life and sal<u>vation</u> for all. By ac<u>cepting</u> death in the flesh, You have granted us immor<u>tal</u>ity. You have <u>freed</u> us by being <u>placed</u> in the tomb, and have resurrected us with Yourself in <u>glory</u>, as God.// Glory to You, O <u>Lord</u> and <u>Lover</u> of man!

Your cruci<u>fix</u>ion and descent into hell are awesome, O <u>Lov</u>er of man.

You have captured it, releasing the ancient <u>prisoners</u>. You have <u>opened Paradise</u> and <u>given</u> it to us. <u>Grant</u> us purification of sins, who glorify Your Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day! Make us <u>wor</u>thy of <u>Paradise</u>// and <u>save</u> us, O <u>Lov</u>er of man!

For our <u>sake</u>, You accepted <u>death</u> in the flesh, to rise from the dead on the <u>third</u> day. <u>Heal</u> us from our earthly <u>passions</u>, and restore us from our evil transgressions;// and save us, O Lover of man!

Adam, rejoice with our first Mother, and do not hide yourselves as you did of old in Paradise; for having seen you naked,
He has appeared to clothe you with the first garment.//
Christ has appeared to renew all creation.

# Dismissal Theotokion, tone 5:

Rejoice, Impassable Gate of the Lord! Rejoice, Wall and Protection of those who run to you! Rejoice, Unshakable Refuge! Rejoice, you who knew not wedlock, Who gave birth in the flesh to your Creator and God:// Do not cease praying for those who praise and worship your Son.

Gospel: (1) Mark 1:1-8 The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. As it is written in the Prophets: "Behold, I send My messenger before Your face, Who will prepare Your way before You. The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the LORD; make His paths straight.'" John came baptizing in the wilderness and preaching a baptism of repentance for the remission of sins. Then all the land of Judea, and those from Jerusalem, went out to him and were all baptized by him in the Jordan River, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair and with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. And he preached, saying, "There comes One after me who is mightier than I, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to stoop down and loose. I indeed baptized you with water, but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."
