#### **NOVEMBER 21** The Entrance of the Theotokos into the Temple

#### The Entry into the Temple of the Most Holy Mother of God.

When the most holy Virgin Mary had reached the age of three, her parents, holy Joachim and Anna, took her from Nazareth to Jerusalem, to give her to the service of God in fulfillment of their promise. It was three days journey to Jerusalem, but, going as they were on God's work, they did not find the journey difficult. Many of Joachim and Anna's kinsmen gathered to take part in this celebration, in which the invisible angels of God also took part. Maidens went ahead with lighted candles in their hands, followed by the most holy Virgin, led on either side by her father and mother. The Virgin was clad in royal and beautiful garments, like those of the 'king's daughter', the Bride of God (Ps. 44:9,10). Behind them walked many of their kinsfolk and friends, all bearing lighted candles. There were fifteen steps leading to the Temple. Her parents stood the Virgin on the first step, and she ran quickly to the top on her own, where the High Priest, Zacharias, the father of St John the Forerunner, met her and, taking her by the hand, led her not only into the Temple but into the Holy of Holies, the holiest place of all, into which none could enter except the High Priest, and that once a year. St Theophylact of Ochrid says that Zacharias was, out of himself, and moved by God' when he led the Virgin into the chief place in the Temple, beyond the second curtain - otherwise there could be no explanation of his action. Her parents then offered sacrifices to God, according to the Law, received the priest's blessing and returned home, leaving the most holy Virgin in the Temple. She dwelt in the Temple for nine whole years. While her parents were alive, they visited her often. When they departed this life, the holy Virgin was left an orphan, and longed to remain in the Temple for the rest of her days, without entering into marriage. This being contrary both to the Law and Israelite custom, she was confided at the age of twelve to St Joseph, a kinsman of hers in Nazareth, so that she might, under the protection of betrothal, live in virginity and thus fulfill both her desire and the demands of the Law, for it was unknown in Israel at that time for a girl to vow perpetual virginity. The holy Virgin Mary was the first to do this, and was later followed by thousand upon thousand of virgin men and women in the Church of Christ.

### **GREAT VESPERS**

## LORD I CALL: All stikhera of the Feast

tone 1:

To<u>day</u>, let us dance, O <u>faith</u>ful, singing to the Lord in <u>psalms</u> and hymns and <u>hon</u>oring His sanctified Tabernacle, the <u>living Ark</u>, that contained the <u>Word</u> Who can<u>not</u> be contained; for in <u>won</u>drous fashion she is <u>of</u>fered to the Lord as a young <u>child</u> in the flesh, and Zacha<u>riah</u>, the great High Priest, joyfully re<u>ceives</u> her// as the dwelling <u>place</u> of God. To<u>day</u> the living Temple of the holy glory of <u>Christ</u> our God, the pure Maiden who alone is blessed among <u>women</u>, is <u>offered</u> in the <u>Temple</u> of the Law that she may make her <u>dwelling</u> in the <u>Ho</u>ly Place. <u>Joachim and Anna rejoice with her in <u>spi</u>rit, and choirs of virgins <u>sing</u> to the Lord,// chanting psalms, and honoring His <u>Moth</u>er.</u>

You are the <u>preaching</u> of the prophets, O Virgin <u>Mother</u> of God; the glory of the Apostles and the boast of <u>Mar</u>tyrs, and the re<u>new</u>al of all the <u>earth</u>-born, for through <u>you</u>, we are <u>re</u>conciled to God. <u>There</u>fore, being saved by your inter<u>ces</u>sions, we honor your coming into the <u>Tem</u>ple of the Lord; and with the <u>Angel</u> we all cry out to <u>you</u> in song:// "Rejoice, O all-revered <u>La</u>dy!"

#### tone 4:

Led by the Holy <u>Spir</u>it, the holy Maiden without blemish is brought to dwell in the Holy of <u>Hol</u>ies, where she is <u>fed</u> by an <u>angel</u>. She is truly the most holy Temple of our <u>ho</u>ly God, Who has made all things holy by <u>dwell</u>ing in her,// and has made God-like the fallen nature of <u>mor</u>tals.

The young girls rejoice today, and with lamps in hand they go before the <u>spiritual Lamp</u>, as she is <u>led</u> with reverence into the Holy of <u>Ho</u>lies. They foreshadow the Brightness past <u>telling</u> Who is to <u>shine forth</u> from her// and enlighten by the Spirit those who sat in the darkness of <u>ig</u>norance.

Anna the all-praised cried out rejoicing: "Receive, O Zachariah, her whom God's Prophets proclaimed in the <u>Spirit</u>, and <u>bring</u> her into the holy <u>Temple</u>, there to be brought up in <u>rev</u>erence, that she may become the divine throne of the <u>Mas</u>ter of all,// His palace and resting place and dwelling <u>filled</u> with light!"

## GLORY...NOWAND EVER... of the Feast, tone 8:

After your <u>birth</u>, O Lady and <u>Bride</u> of God, you came to the <u>Temple</u> of the Lord to be brought up in the Holy of Holies, since you your<u>self</u> are <u>holy</u>. And Gabriel then was sent to you, all-blameless Maiden, to <u>bring</u> you food. All in <u>heav</u>en were amazed to see how the Holy Spirit had <u>made</u> His <u>abode</u> in you. Therefore, O spotless and undefiled <u>Moth</u>er of God, glorified in <u>heav</u>en and on earth,// save the <u>hu</u>man race!

### **OLD TESTAMENT READINGS**

**The Reading from Exodus:** The Lord spoke to Moses, saying: "On the first day of the first month thou shalt set up the Tabernacle of the Testimony, and thou shalt put in it the Ark and cover it with the veil. Thou shalt bring in the table and the candle stand; and thou shalt set there a golden altar to burn incense before the Ark of the Testimony. And thou shalt put a covering on the door of the Tabernacle of the Testimony. "Then thou shalt take the oil of anointing and anoint the Tabernacle and all that is in it, and consecrate it and all its vessels; and it shall be holy. And thou shalt consecrate the altar of Burnt Offerings; it shall be most holy." And Moses did all that the Lord God, the Holy One of Israel had commanded him. And a cloud covered the Tabernacle of the Testimony and the glory of the Lord filled the Tabernacle. Moses was not able to enter the Tabernacle of the Tabernacle. (*Exod. 40:1-5, 9, 10, 16, 34-35*)

**The Reading from the Third Book of Kings** And it came to pass when Solomon had finished building the house of the Lord, he assembled all the elders of Israel in Zion, to bring the Ark of the Covenant of the Lord out of the City of David, which is Zion. And the priests took up the Ark of the Covenant of the Lord, the Tabernacle of the Testimony, and all the holy vessels that were in the Tabernacle of the Testimony. And the King and all Israel went before the Ark. And the priests brought the Ark of the Covenant of the Lord to its place, into the Oracle of the Temple – into the Holy of Holies, under the wings of the cherubim. For the cherubim spread out their wings over the place of the Ark so that the cherubim made a covering above the Ark and its holy things above. There was nothing in the Ark except the two tablets of the Covenant which Moses put there at Horeb, when the Lord had made a Covenant. And when the priests came out from the holy place, a cloud filled the house. And the priests were unable to stand to minister because of the cloud, for the glory of the Lord God Almighty filled the house. (*1 Kings 7:51, 8:1, 3-7, 9-11*)

### The reading from the prophecy of Ezekiel

At the end of these days, from the eighth day on, the priests are to present your burnt offerings and fellowship offerings on the altar. Then I will accept you, declares the Sovereign LORD." Then the man brought me back to the outer gate of the sanctuary, the one facing east, and it was shut.

The LORD said to me, "This gate is to remain shut. It must not be opened; no one may enter through it. It is to remain shut because the LORD, the God of Israel, has entered through it. The prince himself is the only one who may sit inside the gateway to eat in the presence of the LORD. He is to enter by way of the portico of the gateway and go out the same way."

Then the man brought me by way of the north gate to the front of the temple. I looked and saw the glory of the LORD filling the temple of the LORD, and I fell facedown. (43:27-44:4)

**PROKEIMENON, tone 3 (Song of the Theotokos):** My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior.

**EPISTLE: (320) Hebrews 9:1-7 (Theotokos)** Brethren, even the first covenant had ordinances of divine service and the earthly sanctuary. For a tabernacle was prepared: the first part, in which was the candlestand, and the table, and the showbread, which is called the Sanctuary; and behind the second veil, the part of the tabernacle which is called the Holiest of All, which had the golden censer, and the ark of the covenant overlaid on all sides with gold, in which were the golden pot that had the manna, and Aaron's rod that budded, and the tablets of glory shadowing the mercy seat; of which we cannot now speak in detail. Now

when these things had been thus ordained, the priests always went into the first part of the tabernacle, accomplishing the service of God. But into the second part the high priest went alone once every year, not without blood, which he offered for himself, and for sins of the people...
