SUNDAY, MARCH 21, 2021 FIRST SUNDAY OF GREAT LENT SUNDAY OF ORTHODOXY

The first Sunday of Great Lent is called the Sunday of Orthodoxy because it commemorates the restoration of the Holy Icons and the triumph of the Orthodox Faith against the terrible heresy of the Iconoclasts, i.e. those heretics who refused to honor the Holy Icons. For more than a hundred years the Church was disturbed by the evil doctrine of iconoclasm.

The first Emperor to persecute the Church was Leo the Isaurian, and the last was Theophilos, the spouse of Saint Theodora (February 11), who reigned after her husband's death and reestablished Orthodoxy in the time of Patriarch Methodios (June 14). Empress Theodora proclaimed publicly that we do not kiss the Icons as a sign of worship, nor do we honor them as "gods," but as images of their prototypes.

In the year 843, on the first Sunday of the Fast, Saint Theodora and her son, Emperor Michael, venerated the Holy Icons together with the clergy and the people. Since that time this event has been commemorated every year, because it was definitively determined that we do not worship the Icons, but we honor and glorify all the Saints who are depicted on them. We worship only the Triune God: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, and no one else, neither a Saint, nor an Angel.

Originally, the Holy Prophets Moses, Aaron, and Samuel were commemorated on this Sunday. The Alleluia verses appointed for today's Liturgy (see Sunday bulletin) reflect this older usage.

GREAT VESPERS

<u>LORD I CALL</u> Six stikhera of the Resurrection in tone 8, followed by four stikhera of the Triodion

Resurrection, tone 8:

We <u>offer</u> to <u>You</u>, O Christ, our evening song and reasonable <u>ser</u>vice, for You <u>willed</u> to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by Your Resurrection.

Lord, <u>Lord</u>, do not cast us a<u>way</u> from Your face! For You willed to have <u>mer</u>cy on us// by the Resur<u>rec</u>tion.

Rejoice, holy Zion!
Mother of the churches, the abode of God!
For you were the first to receive remission of sins//
by the Resurrection.

The <u>Word</u> of God the <u>Father</u>, begotten before the <u>ages</u>, in the latter times willed to be in<u>car</u>nate of the <u>Virgin</u> and endured cruci<u>fi</u>xion unto death. He has saved <u>mortal man//</u> by His Resur<u>rection</u>.

We glorify You, O Lord for You voluntarily endured the Cross for our sake. We fall down in worship before You, almighty Savior. Do not cast us away from Your face but hear us and save us, Lover of mankind//by Your Resurrection!

Glory to You, O Savior Christ, only begotten Son of God, nailed to the Cross// and resurrected from the tomb on the third day!

Triodion, tone 6:

O Lord, Whom nothing can contain or grasp, from all eternity You shone forth from the Father before the morning star.

The prophets, inspired by the Holy Spirit, foretold that You would take flesh and assume the form of a child, from her who is ever-virgin.

You lived among men;
You were seen by material creation.

Through the prayers of the prophets, O compassionate One, make us worthy to receive Your light,// for we sing praises to Your glorious Resurrection!

The Prophets bore the fruit of e<u>ternal life</u>; they prepared the <u>way</u> of the Lord.

By their words they proclaimed to You; by their deeds they <u>hon</u>ored You. They would not worship creation instead of You, the Creator.

As Your Gospel commands, they re<u>nounced</u> the world.

They foretold Your passion by <u>suffering</u> themselves.

Through their <u>prayers</u>, O Lord,//

enable us to pass over the battlefield of Lent without sin!

You are infinite in Your divine nature, O <u>Mas</u>ter; in these latter days You accepted the limitations of the flesh. By assuming our body, You accepted all its <u>weak</u>nesses. Therefore we make <u>images</u> of Your form; we venerate them, having <u>You</u> in mind. We fall down be<u>fore</u> You in love; by so doing we follow the tradition of the Apostles,// and are given the grace of <u>healing</u>.

Today the Church of Christ receives honorable a<u>dorn</u>ment: the holy icons of Christ our Savior, the Theotokos, and <u>all</u> the Saints. The Church ex<u>ults</u> in their grace.

We lift them up with joy and <u>glad</u>ness.

We glorify God, the <u>Lov</u>er of man,//
Him Who patiently <u>suffered</u> for our sake.

GLORY... Triodion in tone 2:

Grace and truth have shone forth.

The predictions of old have been <u>clearly</u> fulfilled.

Behold, the Church adorns herself with the form of Christ incarnate.

The icons of the new creation transcend the adornments of the old.

As the Ark of the Covenant held the <u>presence</u> of God,

so <u>now</u> the icons reveal the presence of the <u>One</u> we adore.

By honoring them we will <u>nev</u>er go astray.

It is our glory to fall down and worship Christ in the flesh.

Come, O faithful, venerate His image and cry out://

"O Lord, save Your people and bless Your inheritance!"

NOW AND EVER... Dogmatikon in tone 8:

The <u>King of heaven</u>, because of His <u>love</u> for man, appeared on <u>earth</u> and <u>dwelt</u> with men. He took flesh from the pure <u>Virgin</u> and after assuming it, He came <u>forth</u> from her. The Son is one: in two <u>na</u>tures, yet one <u>Per</u>son.

Proclaiming Him as perfect God and perfect Man,

we confess Christ our God!//

Entreat him, O unwedded Mother, to have mercy on our souls!

<u>APOSTIKHA</u>: All stikhera of the Resurrection in tone 8:

Descending from heaven to ascend the Cross,

the Eternal Life has <u>come</u> for death to raise <u>those</u> who are fallen; to enlighten those in <u>darkness</u>.// Jesus, our Savior and illuminator, <u>glory</u> to You!

We <u>glorify</u> Christ, who <u>rose</u> from the dead. He accepted the human <u>body</u> and soul, and freed <u>both</u> from suffering. His most pure soul descended to <u>hell</u>, which He spoiled. His holy body did not see cor<u>ruption</u> in the tomb.// He is the Redeemer of our souls.

In <u>psalms</u> and songs we glorify Your Resurrection from the <u>dead</u>, O Christ. By it, You have freed us from the <u>tortures</u> of hell// and as God have granted eternal life and great <u>mercy</u>.

Master of all, incomprehensible Creator of heaven and earth, by Your suffering on the Cross You have gained passionlessness for me. Accepting burial and arising in glory, You resurrected Adam with Yourself by Your almighty hand. Glory to Your rising on the third day! By it You have granted us eternal life and cleansing of sins// as the only compassionate One.

GLORY... Triodion, tone 2:

Advancing from false doctrine to <u>true</u> faith, illumined with the light of <u>know</u>ledge, let us <u>clap</u> our hands and offer grateful praise to <u>God</u> in song! With due honor let us venerate the holy <u>i</u>cons of Christ, of the all-pure Virgin, and of <u>all</u> the saints, de<u>picted</u> on walls or panels or sacred <u>ves</u>sels, rejecting the godless teaching of the <u>heretics!</u> For as Saint <u>Basil</u> says:

"The <u>hon</u>or shown to the image passes to its <u>prototype</u>."

By the prayers of Your pure Mother and of <u>all</u> the saints,// we beseech You, O Christ our God, to <u>grant</u> us great <u>mercy!</u> that He may be bountiful and save our souls!

NOW AND EVER ... Resurrection, tone 2:

A new miracle surpasses all ancient <u>miracles!</u>
Who knows of a Mother who gave birth with<u>out</u> a man, who <u>car</u>ried in her arms her Creator?
This birth is the <u>will</u> of God!
Since you carried Him as an infant in your arms, O most <u>pure</u> one,

and since you possess motherly boldness before Him, do not cease praying for us who honor you,// that He may be bountiful and save our souls!

TROPARIA

Resurrection, tone 8

Thou didst descend from on high, O Merciful One! Thou didst accept the three day burial to free us from our sufferings! O Lord, our Life and Resurrection: glory to Thee.

Sunday of Orthodoxy, tone 2

We <u>ven</u>erate Your most pure image, O <u>Good</u> One; and ask forgiveness of our transgressions, O <u>Christ</u> our God. Of Your own <u>will</u> You were pleased to ascend the <u>Cross</u> in the flesh and deliver Your creatures from bondage to the <u>En</u>emy. <u>There</u>fore with thankfulness we cry a<u>loud</u> to You: "You have filled all with joy, O our <u>Sav</u>ior,// by coming to save the world."

Resurrection Dismissal Theotokion, tone 2

All beyond <u>thought</u>, all most <u>glo</u>rious, are your mysteries, O Theo<u>to</u>kos.

Sealed in <u>purity</u>, preserved in virginity, you were revealed to be the true Mother who gave birth to the <u>True</u> God.// Entreat Him to save our souls.
