SUNDAY, MARCH 7, 2021 SUNDAY OF THE LAST JUDGMENT MEATFARE SUNDAY

Today's Gospel reading is Matthew 25:31-46, the parable of the Last Judgment. It reminds us that while trusting in Christ's love and mercy, we must not forget His righteous judgment when He comes again in glory. If our hearts remain hardened and unrepentant, we should not expect the Lord to overlook our transgressions simply because He is a good and loving God. Although He does not desire the death of a sinner, He also expects us to turn from our wickedness and live (Ezek. 33:11). This same idea is expressed in the prayer read by the priest after the penitent has confessed his or her sins (Slavic practice).

The time for repentance and forgiveness is now, in the present life. At the Second Coming, Christ will appear as the righteous Judge, "Who will render to every man according to his deeds" (Rom. 2:6). Then the time for entreating God's mercy and forgiveness will have passed.

As Father Alexander Schmemann reminds us in his book GREAT LENT (Ch. 1:4), sin is the absence of love, it is separation and isolation. When Christ comes to judge the world, His criterion for judgment will be love. Christian love entails seeing Christ in other people, our family, our friends, and everyone else we may encounter in our lives. We shall be judged on whether we have loved, or not loved, our neighbor. We show Christian love when we feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, visit those who are sick or in prison. If we did such things for the least of Christ's brethren, then we also did them for Christ (Mt.25:40). If we did not do such things for the least of the brethren, neither did we do them for Christ (Mt.25:45).

Today is the last day for eating meat and meat products until Pascha, though eggs and dairy products are permitted every day during the coming week. This limited fasting prepares us gradually for the more intense fasting of Great Lent.

GREAT VESPERS

<u>LORD I CALL</u>: Six stikhera of the Resurrection in tone 6, followed by four from the Lenten Triodion

Tone 6:

Possessing victory over <u>hell</u>, O Christ, since You are <u>free</u> among the dead, You as<u>cended</u> the Cross raising with Yourself those who sat in the <u>shades</u> of death.//
O Almighty Savior, Who drew life from Your own light, have <u>mercy</u> on us!

Today Christ tramples on death, for He is risen as He said!
Let us all sing this song, for He has granted joy to the world:
"O Light unapproachable, O Fountain of life!// Savior Almighty, have mercy on us!"

Where shall we sinners flee from You, for You are in all creation? In heaven You dwell! In hell You trampled on death! In the depths of the sea? Even there is Your hand, O Master!. To You we flee, and falling before You, we pray://
"As You rose from the dead, have mercy on us!"

In Your Cross, we <u>glory</u>, O Christ. We sing and glorify Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion. For <u>You</u> are our God,// and we know no other than You.

We will always <u>bless</u> the Lord by singing of His Resur<u>rection!</u> for He <u>endured</u> the Cross,// trampling down <u>death</u> by death.

Glory to Your <u>might</u>, O Lord, for You overthrew the <u>prince</u> of death! By Your Cross You have <u>renewed</u> us,//granting us life and incor<u>rup</u>tion.

Triodion, tone 6:

O Righteous Judge of <u>all</u> mankind,
You will come, enthroned in glory and escorted by <u>Ang</u>els, to judge the <u>liv</u>ing and the dead.
Every man will stand in fear be<u>fore</u> You, trembling at the river of fire flowing <u>past</u> Your throne, as each one waits to hear the <u>sen</u>tence he deserves.
On that awesome day have mercy on us as <u>well</u>, O Christ; count us worthy of sal<u>vation</u>, for, worthless as we are, we turn to <u>You</u> in faith,//
O compassionate and merciful Lord!

The books will be opened, and the works of all <u>men</u> laid bare; the vale of tears will echo with the <u>gnashing</u> of teeth; the sinners will mourn in vain, as they depart to eternal dam<u>nation</u>. Your judgments are just, O Lord Al<u>mighty</u>! We beg You, O Master, full of goodness and compassion,//

take pity on us who sing to You, O most merciful One!

The trumpet shall sound, and the graves shall be opened; all mankind will arise in trembling; the righteous will rejoice, as they receive their reward, but the wicked will depart to eternal fire with wailing and horror. O Lord of Glory, have mercy on us!

Number us with those who love You,//
for You alone are good, O Master!

I shudder in terror when I think of that <u>dreadful</u> day; I weep as I consider the darkness that will <u>nev</u>er see light: there the worm shall not cease, or the <u>fire</u> be quenched; the pain of those who reject You will <u>nev</u>er end. Save me, Your most worthless servant, O <u>Right</u>eous Judge,// for Your mercy and compassion are my only hope!

GLORY... Triodion, tone 8:

When the <u>thrones</u> are set in place and the books are <u>opened</u>, then God will take His place on the <u>judg</u>ment seat.

<u>Oh</u>, what a <u>fearful</u> sight!

The Angels stand in awe, and the river of <u>fire</u> flows by.

What shall we do, who are already condemned by our <u>many</u> sins, as we hear Christ call the righteous to His <u>Fa</u>ther's <u>King</u>dom, and send the wicked to eternal dam<u>nation</u>?

Who among us can bear that terrible <u>verdict</u>?

Hasten to us, O Lover of mankind and <u>King</u> of the <u>universe</u>; grant us the grace of repentance be<u>fore</u> the end,// and have <u>mercy</u> on us!

NOW AND EVER... the Dogmatikon in tone 6:

Who will not bless you, O most holy <u>Virgin?</u>
Who will not sing of your most pure <u>child</u>bearing?
The only-begotten Son shone timelessly from the <u>Fa</u>ther, but from you He was ineffably in<u>car</u>nate.
God by nature, He became <u>Man</u> for our sake, not divided into two persons but manifest as One in two <u>na</u>tures. Entreat Him, O pure and all-blessed <u>La</u>dy,// to have <u>mer</u>cy on our souls!

<u>APOSTIKHA</u>: All stikhera of the Resurrection in tone 6:

Your Resurrection, O Christ our <u>Sav</u>ior, the Angels in <u>heaven sing!</u>
Enable <u>us</u> on earth//
to glorify You in <u>purity</u> of heart!

Destroying the gates of hell,

breaking the <u>chains</u> of death, You resurrected the fallen human race as al<u>mighty</u> God!// O Lord, Who rose from the dead, <u>glory</u> to You!

Desiring to return us to <u>Par</u>adise,
Christ was nailed to the Cross and <u>placed</u> in a tomb.
The Myrrhbearing Women sought Him with tears, <u>cry</u>ing,
"Woe to us, O <u>Sav</u>ior!
How do You deign to de<u>scend</u> to death?
What place can hold Your life bearing <u>body</u>?
Come to us as You <u>promised!</u>
Take away our <u>wailing</u> and tears!"
Then the Angel appeared to them:
"Stop your lamentations!
Go, proclaim to the Apostles:
'The Lord is <u>risen</u>,//
granting us purification and great mercy!""

Having been <u>cru</u>cified as You willed, by Your burial You captured <u>death</u>, O Christ, and rose on the third day as God in <u>glory</u>,// granting the world unending life and great <u>mercy</u>!

GLORY... from the Triodion, tone 8:

Woe, to you, O my darkened soul!

Your life is stained by depravity and <u>laziness</u>;

your folly makes you shun all thought of death.

How complacent you remain!

How can you flee the awesome thought of <u>Judg</u>ment Day?

When will you <u>change</u> your <u>way</u> of life?

On that day your sins will rise against you.

What will your <u>an</u>swer be then?

Your acts will condemn you; your deeds will expose you.

The time is at <u>hand</u>, O my soul.

Turn to the good and loving Savior!

Beg Him to forgive your malice and weakness, as you cry in faith:

"I have sinned, O Lord, I have sinned against You,

but I know Your love for all mankind.//

O good Shepherd, call me to enjoy Your lasting presence on Your right hand!"

NOW AND EVER... Resurrectional Theotokion in tone 8:

Unwedded Virgin,

you ineffably conceived God in the flesh.

O Mother of God most high,

accept the cries of your servants, O blameless one!

Grant cleansing of transgressions to all!//

Receive our prayers and pray to save our souls!

TROPARIA

Resurrection, tone 6

The angelic powers were at Thy tomb; the guards became as dead men.

Mary stood by Thy grave, seeking Thy most pure Body.

Thou didst capture hell, not being tempted by it.

Thou didst come to the Virgin, granting life.

O Lord who didst rise from the dead: glory to Thee.

Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion, tone 6

You Who called Your Mother <u>bless</u>ed, came of Your own will to the <u>Pas</u>sion.

Shining on the Cross, desiring to recall Adam, You said to the <u>Ang</u>els: "Rejoice with me for the lost <u>coin</u> has been found."

You Who have ordered all things in <u>wis</u>dom// our God, glory to You!
