Epistle — Romans 6: 18-23

¹⁸ Having been released from sin, you became slaves of righteousness.

¹⁹ I speak in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh. Indeed, as you used to offer your members as slaves of impurity and ever-increasing wickedness, now offer your members as slaves of righteousness for sanctification. ²⁰ For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. ²¹ What fruit did you obtain at that time by those things which now shame you? The end result of those things is death! ²² But now, being made free from sin and having become enslaved to God, you have your fruit of sanctification, and the result of eternal life. ²³ The wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Epistle — Hebrews 13: 7-16

⁷ Remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God: consider the outcome of their life, and imitate their faith. ⁸ Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and for ever. ⁹ Do not be led away by diverse and strange teachings; for it is well that the heart be strengthened by grace, not by foods, which have not benefited their adherents. ¹⁰ We have an altar from which those who serve the tent have no right to eat. ¹¹ For the bodies of those animals whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest as a sacrifice for sin are burned outside the camp. ¹² So Jesus also suffered outside the gate in order to sanctify the people through his own blood. ¹³ Therefore let us go forth to him outside the camp and bear the abuse he endured. ¹⁴ For here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city which is to come.¹⁵ Through him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name. ¹⁶ Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

Today's Worship — Scripture Readings

Gospel — Matthew 8: 5-13

⁵ When Jesus came into Capernaum, a centurion came to him, imploring him ⁶ and saying, "Lord, my servant is lying in the house paralyzed, grievously tormented." ⁷ Jesus answered, "I will come and heal him." ⁸ But the centurion replied, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should come under my roof! Only say the word and my servant shall be healed. ⁹ For I am also a man under authority, having soldiers under my own authority. I tell this one, 'Go,' and he goes; and if I tell another, 'Come,' he comes. Or if I tell my servant, 'Do this,' he does it!"

¹⁰ When Jesus heard this, he marveled and said to those who followed, "Amen, I tell you that I have never found so great a faith, not even in Israel! ¹¹ I tell you that many will come from the east and the west, and will sit down with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the Kingdom of Heaven. ¹² But the children of the Kingdom will be thrown out into the outer darkness and there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth." ¹³ Jesus said to the centurion, "Go your way. Let it be done for you as you have believed." And his servant was healed in that hour.

Gospel — John 17:1-13

¹ When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify thy Son that the Son may glorify thee, ² since thou hast given him power over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom thou hast given him. ³ And this is eternal life, that they know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom thou hast sent. ⁴ I glorified thee on earth, having accomplished the work which thou gavest me to do; ⁵ and now, Father, glorify thou me in thy own presence with the glory which I had with thee before the world was made.

⁶ "I have manifested thy name to the men whom thou gavest me out of the world; thine they were, and thou gavest them to me, and they have kept thy word. ⁷ Now they know that everything that thou hast given me is from thee; ⁸ for I have given them the words which thou gavest me, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from thee; and they have believed that thou didst send me. 9 I am praying for them; I am not praying for the world but for those whom thou hast given me, for they are thine; ¹⁰ all mine are thine, and thine are mine, and I am glorified in them. ¹¹ And now I am no more in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to thee. Holy Father, keep them in thy name, which thou hast given me, that they may be one, even as we are one.¹² While I was with them, I kept them in thy name, which thou hast given me; I have guarded them, and none of them is lost but the son of perdition, that the scripture might be fulfilled.¹³ But now I am coming to thee; and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves.

Our Life in Ghrist—Questions & Answers

Gensing Around the Ghurch & Question about the Great Entrance

"I notice when the priest censes the icons around the church some people turn to follow the priest and others stay facing front. Which is proper?"

There are different pious traditions that exist in the church when it comes to liturgical actions like the one you mention. However, even with these differences there is always a common thread that must exist between them.

Some people have been taught that when the priest senses the icons around the church we should turn and follow him with our attention, recognizing the presence of the holy ones represented in the icons with us as he censes. Others have been taught that our attention is to remain forward toward the altar at all times, recognizing that our focus must remain on Christ.

It is not possible to dictate which of these is more "proper" since both are long-standing traditions that have been passed down through pious and faithful families. Both are based upon solid understandings of what it means to be a member of Christ's Church and heirs to His Kingdom.

However, regardless of which we choose, we must remember the truth revealed in the other. If we turn and follow the priest as he censes we must do so without turning our back to the altar, as it is the meeting place of Heaven and Earth. We should follow the priest until that point when our back would face the altar and then turn back toward the altar and then continue with the priest as he finishes. Likewise, if we remain standing forward, we must be sure not to ignore the presence of the holy saints that are alive in Christ and truly present with us during the service.

In either case, we must **never** use such instances as an opportunity for judgment or pride, thinking that we "know better" or that others are "misinformed" or not as pious as we imagine our self to be.

"I hear some people saying something at the very end of the Great Entrance to the priest. What are they saying and is it something we are all supposed to say?"

During the Great Entrance when the priest exclaims, "You and all Orthodox Christians, may the Lord God remember in His Kingdom..." some faithful will respond to the priest "May the Lord God remember your priesthood in His Kingdom, always now and ever and unto ages of ages." It is a tradition that is part of the ongoing conversation that takes place between the priest and the faithful throughout the divine services of the Church. It falls into the same spirit as when the priest says, "Peace be unto all" and the people respond, "And to your spirit."

While, in this instance it is not a formalized part of the service and is therefore not "required", it is a response made by the faithful to the priest out of love and prayerful concern for his soul and the ministry he performs.
