SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 19, 2010 AFTERFEAST OF THE ELEVATION OF THE CROSS MARTYRS TROPHIMUS, SABBATIUS AND DORYMEDON

The Holy Martyrs Trophimus, Sabbatius and Dorymedon suffered for Christ during the reign of the Roman emperor Probus (276-282). A pagan festival was being celebrated in the city of Antioch. Sacrificial offerings were brought, the wine was poured, and vile acts were performed. The Christians Trophimus and Sabbatius arrived in the city just as the festival was taking place, and were saddened by this loud and indecent spectacle. They prayed that the Lord would guide the errant on the way of salvation. As they said this, the idolaters noticed their presence. Seeing that the strangers did not worship the idols, they arrested them and took them to the governor.

At their interrogation, the saints firmly confessed their faith. When they were told to renounce Christ, they resolutely refused to do so. Saint Sabbatius died under the fierce torment. Saint Trophimus was sent to the city of Synnada in Phrygia for even more terrible tortures.

For three days Saint Trophimus walked shod in iron sandals with sharp nails, driven on by a cavalry guard. The governor of Frigius, Dionysius, infamous as a torturer and executioner, used all manner of tortures to break the will of the brave Christian. Saint Trophimus merely repeated the words of Scripture: "many afflictions has the righteous one, but from them all will the Lord deliver him" (Ps 33/34:20).

The senator Dorymedon, a secret Christian, visited Saint Trophimus in prison, washing and binding his wounds. When the pagans learned that the senator would not participate in the festival of Castor and Pollux, they asked the reason for his refusal. He said that he was a Christian, and would not attend a festival in honor of the demons. He and Saint Trophimus were thrown to the wild beasts to be eaten by them, but the martyrs remained unharmed. Then they were beheaded with the sword.

The Cross depicted of old by the Prophet Moses, the faithful seer and beloved of God, routed the hordes of the foreign oppressors. Now, shown forth in divine elevation at the hands of sacred ministers,

it dispels the hordes of demons and as<u>sem</u>blies of <u>e</u>vil ones,// reproving the boldness of the un<u>god</u>ly.

Your Cross, our Savior, is the invincible might of Christians. By it multitudes of enemies are <u>van</u>quished; the <u>peace</u> of Your Church, O Christ, is given to those who offer fitting <u>glory</u>.

As we venerate it now, we entreat You, O <u>Lov</u>er of mankind:// count us worthy of a <u>por</u>tion with Your saints!

Saints, tone 8:

De<u>sir</u>ing to take pleasure in inex<u>haust</u>ible food, O martyr Tro<u>phí</u>mus, you strove with the <u>pain</u> of your <u>body</u>, passing over from corruption to incor<u>rup</u>tion, rejoicing and adorned with the witness of your <u>mar</u>tyrdom.// Therefore by your prayers entreat great <u>mer</u>cy for us all!

The <u>glorious Sabbatius</u>, having endured many <u>torments</u>,

has now been blessed to celebrate with great joy in the <u>courts</u> of heaven.

Receiving honors for his <u>struggles</u>, he is numbered among the assemblies of <u>Angels.//</u> By his prayers, O Christ, grant Your people great <u>mercy!</u>

Destroying the counsel of the ungodly, O Dorymedon, you steadied your mind with divine counsels. You entered courageously upon the trials of tortures, receiving trophies of honor.//
Now you ever reign with Christ, praying for us all.

GLORY... for the Feast, tone 4:

Let us proclaim today a festival of song, and, with radiant faces let us <u>loud</u>ly exclaim: "O Christ, You have accepted condemnation for us, and, after enduring spitting and scourging, You were robed in purple and ascended the Cross. Seeing You, the sun and the moon hid their light, the earth quaked in fear, and the veil of the Temple was torn in two. Grant us Your precious Cross as our guardian and protector, which drives demons away, that we may all embrace it and cry out: 'Save us by your power, O Cross! Sanctify us by your radiance, O precious Cross, and strengthen us through your Exaltation;// for you have been given to us as the light and salvation of our souls!"
