Today's Worship — Scripture Readings

Epistle — 2 Cor 6: 16-7:1

¹⁶What agreement can there be between God's sanctuary and idols? For you are a sanctuary of the living God. Even as God said, "I will dwell in them, and walk in them; and I will be their God, and they will be my people." ¹⁷Therefore:

'Come out from among them and be separate,' says the Lord.

'Touch no unclean thing.

I will receive you.

¹⁸I will be a Father to you.

You will be to me sons and daughters,'

says the Lord Almighty."

Since we have these promises, beloved, let us purify ourselves from all defilement of flesh and spirit, so that we may bring [our] holiness to completion in the fear of God.

Gospel — Luke 8: 5-15

⁵"A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was sowing, some [seed] fell along the wayside; it was trampled under foot, and the birds of the sky devoured it. ⁶Other seed fell on the rock, and as soon as it grew, it withered away because it had no moisture. ⁷Other fell among the thorns, and the thorns grew with it, and choked it. ⁸Other fell into the good ground, grew, and brought forth fruit a hundred times." As he said this, he exclaimed, "Let anyone with ears to hear listen!"

⁹Then his disciples asked him, "What does this parable mean?"

¹⁰Jesus replied, "To you it is given to know the mysteries of the Kingdom of God, but to the rest, [it is given] in parables, so that 'seeing they may not see, and hearing they may not understand.'

¹¹Now this is what the parable means: The seed is the word of God. ¹²Those along the wayside are those who have heard. Then the devil comes and takes away the word from their heart, so that they may not believe and be saved. ¹³Those on the rock are those who receive the word with joy when they hear. But they have no root; they believe for a while, then fall away in time of temptation. ¹⁴What fell among the thorns is those who have heard, and as they go on their way, they are choked with worries, wealth, and the pleasures of life; and they bring no fruit to maturity. ¹⁵As for the seed that fell in the rich soil, this is those who have heard the word with an honest and good heart, who retain it and bring forth fruit with endurance.

Bible Question(s)

ACCORDING TO THE BIBLE.....

**Q. IN CHAPTER 4 WHO WAS ADAM & EVE'S "FIRST BORN"?
Q. OF THE 3 SON'S OF ADAM & EVE WHO IS NOAH'S DIRECT
ANCESTOR (GENESIS CHAPTER 5)?**

Reflection/Discussion: Why do you think in the scriptures about the Fall of Mankind (Gen 3) and the Murder of Abel (Gen 4) God asks those who sinned (Adam, Eve and then Cain) what has happened? Doesn't He already know?

Answers will be included in next week's bulletin. Stay tuned!

This year every week the bulletin will have a Bible Question connected to the Old Testament. After Christmas a "test" will be included in the bulletin. Whoever completes the "test" (you can use past bulletins to help) and submits it will be entered into a raffle for a gift card to their favorite store and/or restaurant.

Q. IN CHAPTER 3 DO ADAM & EVE TAKE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THEIR ACTIONS? A. NO. WHO DOES EVE SAY IS RESPONSIBLE? A. THE SERPENT. WHO DOES ADAM SAY IS RESPONSIBLE? A. EVE & GOD, HIMSELF
Q. AT THE END OF CHAPTER 3 WHAT KEEPS ADAM & EVE FROM THE GARDEN & THE TREE OF LIFE? A. A CHERUBIN WITH A FIERY SWORD

Reflection/Discussion: Why do you think it was important to God that Adam & Eve not eat of the tree of life and live forever after they had broken their relation with God?

A. According to Orthodox Christian teaching it was out of concern that their sinful state would continue forever, growing infinitely worse. The Tree of Life is now understood as the Cross and we do partake of it's "fruit" when we receive Holy Communion for "the remission of sins & life everlasting"
