### Today's Worship — Scripture Readings

#### Epistle — Galatians 2: 16-20

<sup>16</sup> yet knowing that no one is justified by the works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, we believed in Christ Jesus, so that we might be justified by faith in Christ, and not by the works of the law, because no one will be justified by the works of the law. <sup>17</sup> But if, even though we desired to be justified in Christ, we were found to be sinners, does that mean that Christ is a servant of sin? Certainly not! <sup>18</sup> Indeed, if I build up again those things which I [once] destroyed, I show that I am breaking the law. <sup>19</sup> For I, through the law, died to the law, so that I might live to God. <sup>20</sup>I have been crucified with Christ, and it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. I now live this life in the flesh, but I live [it] by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and who gave himself up for me.

#### Epistle — 1 Corinthians 4:9-16

<sup>9</sup> I think that God has displayed us, the apostles, last of all, like men sentenced to death, because we are made a spectacle to the world, both to angels and people. <sup>10</sup> We are fools for Christ's sake, but you are wise in Christ. We are weak, but you are strong. You have honor, but we have dishonor.<sup>11</sup> Even to this present hour, we hunger and thirst, we are naked, beaten, and [we] wander from place to place! <sup>12</sup> We work hard, with our own hands. When people curse us, we bless [in return]. When we are persecuted, we endure. <sup>13</sup> When we are defamed, we try to conciliate. We are made as the filth of the world, as the dirt wiped off by all, even until now. <sup>14</sup> I do not write these things to shame you, but to admonish you as my beloved children. <sup>15</sup> For although you have ten thousand tutors in Christ, yet [you do] not [have] many fathers. For in Christ Jesus, I became your father through the Good News. <sup>16</sup> I beg you therefore, be imitators of me.

#### Gospel — Luke 10: 25-37

<sup>25</sup>Behold, an expert in the law stood up and put him to the test, saying, "Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?"

<sup>26</sup>Jesus answered, "What is written in the law? How do you read it?"

<sup>27</sup>The man answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself."

<sup>28</sup>Jesus said to him, "You have answered correctly. Do this, and you will live."

<sup>29</sup>But the lawyer, desiring to justify himself, asked Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"

<sup>30</sup>Then Jesus answered. "A certain man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho when he fell into the hands of robbers. They stripped him of his clothes and beat him. Then they went away, leaving him half dead. <sup>31</sup>By chance, a certain priest was going down that way. But when the priest saw him, he passed by on the other side. <sup>32</sup>In the same way, a Levite also came to the place, but when he saw the beaten man, he [also] passed by on the other side. <sup>33</sup>Now a certain Samaritan was traveling and arrived at the spot where the man was. When the Samaritan saw the wounded man, he was moved with compassion, <sup>34</sup>came to him, and wrapped his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. He placed the man on his own animal and brought him to an inn, and took care of him. <sup>35</sup>On the next day, when he was leaving, he took out two denarii and gave them to the host, saying to him, 'Take care of him. Whatever you spend beyond that, I will pay you back when I return.' 36Now which one of these three do you think seemed to be a neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?"

<sup>37</sup>The lawyer replied, "The one who showed mercy on him!"

Then Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

#### Gospel — John 1:43-51

<sup>43</sup> On the next day, being determined to go out into Galilee, Jesus met Philip and said to him, "Follow me!" <sup>44</sup> Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. <sup>45</sup> Philip found Nathaniel and said to him, "We have found the one of whom Moses in the law and the prophets, wrote: Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph!"

<sup>46</sup>Nathanael asked him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?"

Philip replied, "Come and see!"

<sup>47</sup> As Jesus saw Nathaniel coming to him, he said about him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no deceit!"

<sup>48</sup>Nathanael asked Jesus, "How do you know me?"

Jesus answered and said to him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you."

<sup>49</sup>Nathanael replied, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are King of Israel!"

<sup>50</sup> Jesus said to him, "Because I told you, 'I saw you underneath the fig tree,' do you believe? You will see greater things than these!" <sup>51</sup> He said to Philip, "Amen, amen, I tell you; hereafter, you will see heaven opened, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man."
