

Today's Worship — Scripture Readings

Epistle—Ephesians 4: 7-13

⁷ But grace has been granted to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift.

⁸ Therefore, God says, "When he ascended on high, he led captivity captive, and gave gifts to men." ⁹ Now what does "he ascended" mean, if not that he first descended into the lower parts of the earth? ¹⁰ He who descended is the [same] one who also ascended far above all the heavens, so that he might fill all things.

¹¹ He gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some shepherds and teachers, ¹² for the perfecting of the saints, for a work of ministry, to build up the body of Christ. ¹³ This is until we all attain to the unity of the faith and to the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, having reached the very fullness of Christ.

Our Life in Christ—The Deacon's Beacon

DEACON'S BEACON—LIVING WATER/WATER OF LIFE

A sad and inappropriate dichotomy has evolved over centuries between the Christian Faith and the discoveries of science. Scientific tools have revealed how complex and fascinating the cosmos is in its smallest and grandest expressions. With an expanding knowledge of HOW the universe works, it is ironic that mankind has not become more humbled by the unfathomable question of WHY it exists. Unlike other expressions of Christianity, Orthodoxy has never condemned any irrefutable discovery of science - the earth is not the center of the solar system but still might be the highest expression of God's creation. Anything that has material existence is amenable to being explained - can be "known". That which is uncreated and immaterial cannot be discovered by the scientific method. The uncreated must be experienced to become "known".

Science can teach:

- 1) Water is made of three invisible atoms.
- 2) Most of the earth's surface consists of water.
- 3) The overall amount of water on earth has remained the same for two billion years.
- 4) Water is the only substance that is found naturally on earth in three forms: liquid, gas, solid.
- 5) Of all the water on earth, only 2.5% is fresh water and 90% of that is frozen in Antarctica.
- 6) Less than 1% of the water supply on earth can be used as drinking water.
- 7) Approximately 66% of the human body consists of water.
- 8) A person can live about a month without food, but only about a week without water.
- 9) A developing baby "breathes" water until the moment of his/her birth.
- 10) In the current scientific understanding of the cosmos, life does not exist in the absence of water.

The authors of the Bible knew little or nothing of this science and yet there are over 700 references to water in the Old and New Testaments. Ignorance of "the facts" in no way negates the spiritual revelation of scripture. Water is in the first chapter of Genesis and the last chapter of Revelation. Life springs forth, seas are parted, floods destroy, the rock spills forth in the desert, the woman draws from the well, feet are washed and water flows from the Savior's side.

How appropriate it is then that Christ, the Word through whom all was created chose as the first act of his public ministry to be immersed in the River Jordan — not doing so because of a need for cleansing or repentance but to sanctify the living water of His creation for us and for our salvation. With His baptism water is connected to Him and He makes it the "highway" (i.e., baptism) for us to be connected to Him (Gal 3:27).

May we all experience the Theophany of the Lord and partake of this living water! Amen.

Preparing for Your House Blessing

Sanctification of the home

The blessing of homes with holy water maintains the spiritual association between the 'home or family church' and the parish, as well as again providing for the sharing of God's spiritual gifts. This annual blessing is not as elaborate as the blessing of the new dwelling, but because of this it should not be overlooked, for it is in this way that the grace of God is extended to individual dwellings.

The sanctification of the home takes place with prayer and the sprinkling of holy water. The priest, at this annual visit, asks God to have mercy on the house, to rid it of every evil and to fill if with every blessing. Everyone of the house, prays together for the living and the dead of the family, and all who live and have lived in the house. They all sing the hymn of salvation and process from room to room while the priest blesses the house.

Preparation

Traditions of the ceremony differ according to local custom, but these general guidelines should are observed:

- A candle with an icon and some holy water should be placed in a suitable place, such as kitchen or dining room table, or a home altar.
- Also, a list of first names for whom prayers are to be offered, including members of the family and all those living in the house. The list should have a clear distinction between the living and the dead.
- If it is the practice to give the priest a gift, it should not be placed with the holy objects on the table. It can be prepared in advanced, but given at the conclusion of the service.

The ceremony

When the priest comes, all who are present in the house should gather around the icon with the candle. They should, if they are able to join in, say the Trisagion Prayers and sing of the Troparion of the Feast of Epiphany. Then a family member leads the priest through the house with the candle. As he goes, he sprinkles holy water, and prays for a blessing upon each room and the activity that goes on there. When they have gone through the entire house, the family gathers again around the table and the priest blesses each person present.

Following the feast of Theophany until the beginning of Great Lent (Jan. 6 - Mar 6) Fr. Michael will be blessing homes.

Please contact Fr. Michael to arrange a date and time.
