SUNDAY, MARCH 20, 2022 SECOND SUNDAY OF GREAT LENT SAINT GREGORY PALAMAS

This Sunday is often referred to as a 2nd Triumph of Orthodoxy. St Gregory affirmed that ascetical effort and prayer are the outcome of the mystery of Redemption and are the way for each person to make the grace given at Baptism blossom within himself. He also defended the authenticity of the methods which Hesychastic monastics used to fix the intellect in the heart; for since the Incarnation we seek the grace of the Holy Spirit in our bodies, which are sanctified by the Sacraments and grafted by the Eucharist into the Body of Christ. This uncreated grace is the very glory of God which, as it sprang forth from the body of Christ on the day of the Transfiguration, overwhelmed the disciples (Matthew 17). Shining now in the heart purified from the passions, it truly unites us to God, illumines us, deifies us and gives us a pledge of that same glory which will shine on the bodies of the Saints after the general Resurrection.

In thus affirming the full reality of deification, Gregory was far from denying the absolute transcendence and unknowableness of God in His essence. Following the ancient Fathers, but in a more precise manner, he made a distinction between God's non-participable essence and the eternal, creative and providential energies by which the Lord enables created beings to participate in His being, His life and His light without, however, introducing any division into the unity of the divine Nature. God is not a philosophical concept for Saint Gregory: He is Love, He is Living Person and consuming fire, as Scripture teaches (Deuteronomy 4:24), Who does everything to make us godlike.

Saint Gregory's description was first accepted by the authorities of Mount Athos in the Hagiorite Tome and then adopted by the Church, during the course of two Councils in 1341.

How shall we who dwell on earth praise the holy <u>bishop</u>? He is the Church's teacher, the herald of the Uncreated Light, the in<u>it</u>iate of the Trinity's heavenly <u>mys</u>teries, the adornment of the mo<u>nas</u>tic life, renowned alike in action and contem<u>plation</u>,// Gregory, the <u>pride</u> of Thessalonica;

GLORY... Triodion tone 6:

O thrice-blessed saint, most holy <u>fa</u>ther, good shepherd, disciple of Christ the Chief <u>Shep</u>herd. Like Him you gave your <u>life</u> for your sheep. By your intercessions, O God-bearing Father <u>Greg</u>ory,// may great mercy be granted to our souls!

O Gregory, pride of Thessalonica, do not cease to intercede before Christ our God// to illumine with His Divine Light those who honor you!

Reveal Your <u>love</u> for <u>man</u>, O Merciful One, and accept the Theotokos <u>pray</u>ing for us,// and save the des<u>pair</u>ing <u>peop</u>le, O our <u>Sav</u>ior!
