### JULY 31, 2022 Forefeast of the Procession of the Honorable and Lifegiving Cross of the Lord Righteous Eudocimus of Cappadocia

**Saint Eudokimos,** a native of Cappadocia (Asia Minor), lived during the ninth century during the reign of Emperor Theophilus (829-842). He was the son of the pious Christians Basil and Eudokia, an illustrious family known to the emperor. They raised their son "in discipline and admonition of the Lord" (Eph. 6: 4), planting in his soul a sincere faith and holy virtues.

The righteous life of St. Eudokimos was devoted to pleasing God and serving his neighbor. Having given a vow to remain unmarried and chaste, he avoided conversation with women and did not look at them. He would speak only with his own mother, whom he greatly respected. The emperor valued his virtue and talents, so he appointed St. Eudokimos as governor of Chorziane, Armenia. Fulfilling his duty as a servant of God, St. Eudokimos governed the people justly and with kindness. He concerned himself with the unfortunate, and with orphans and widows, and he was a defender of the common people. His personal Christian exploits which he did in secret, were known only to God.

Eudokimos pleased God by his blameless life, and the Lord called him at age 33. Lying on his deathbed, St. Eudokimos gave final instructions to place him in the grave in those clothes in which he would meet death. Then he sent everyone out of the room and entreated the Lord that no one would see his end, just as no one saw his secret efforts during life. His attendants buried him as he had instructed them. Right after the death of St. Eudokimos miracles took place at his grave. Many sick people were healed, and the news of the miraculous healings spread.

After 18 months, the mother of St. Eudokimos came from Constantinople to venerate his relics. She gave orders to remove the stone, dig up the ground, and open the grave. Everyone beheld the face of the saint, bright as if alive, altogether untouched by decay. A great fragrance came from him. They took up the coffin with the relics from the earth, and they dressed the saint in new clothes. His mother wanted to take the relics of her son to Constantinople, but the Kharsian people would not clear a path for their holy one. After a certain time the hieromonk Joseph, having lived and served at the grave of the saint, transported the relics of St. Eudokimos to Constantinople. There they were placed in a silver reliquary in the church of the Most Holy Theotokos, built by the parents of the saint.

St. Eudokimos is considered by the Russian Church to be one of the special protectors and intercessors before God of the family hearth. He was, as his name implies, truly successful in every virtue.

### **GREAT VESPERS**

<u>LORD I CALL:</u> Four stikhera of the resurrection in tone 6 (spiral bound Vespers book), followed by three for the Cross and three for the saint.

*Cross, tone 1:* <u>Now</u>, as we celebrate the <u>prefeast</u>, let all human nature <u>leap</u> with joy, for the <u>Tree</u> of the Cross, the assurance of <u>heal</u>ing, which gives release from all sickness, <u>suf</u>fering and af<u>flic</u>tion,// will be set before all the <u>faith</u>ful!

<u>Come</u>, O faithful, let us behold the strange <u>won</u>der: How the Tree of the Cross quenches the fire of every in<u>firm</u>ity and ex<u>ting</u>uishes the burning heat of the <u>pas</u>sions in those who <u>cel</u>ebrate its <u>pre</u>feast with faith// and honor the cele<u>brat</u>ion!

All the living celebrate the prefeast with <u>those</u> who have died. For the Tree of Life, the pro<u>tec</u>tor of all, the Resur<u>rec</u>tion of the dead, which <u>killed</u> hell,// now comes to give true grace and <u>healing</u> to all.

### Saint Eudocimus, tone 8:

O <u>bless</u>ed, divinely-wise Eu<u>do</u>cimus, your pure soul, shining with Orthodox under<u>standing</u>, and shedding the light of the <u>ra</u>diance of <u>vir</u>tue, illumined the fullness of the <u>faith</u>ful, and dispelled the darkness of <u>de</u>mons. Therefore, we all <u>hon</u>or you, O <u>won</u>drous one,// for you share in ever-<u>pre</u>sent grace.

Possessed of a compassionate soul, a <u>chaste</u> mind, a vigilant heart, unwavering faith and truly sin<u>cere</u> love, you passed over from <u>earth</u> to the <u>heavens</u>, and made your abode with the choirs of the <u>right</u>eous. Therefore, we all honor you with <u>sa</u>cred hymns// and call you blessed, O holy Eu<u>do</u>cimus.

<u>Strength</u>ened by divine <u>teachings</u>, you drove carnal passions a<u>way</u> from your soul and became a pure abode of the <u>Holy Trin</u>ity. Therefore, you have departed into divine delight, since God has preserved your <u>body</u> incorrupt by godly judgments <u>known</u> to <u>Him</u> alone,// Who clearly glorifies you, O Eudocimus.

### GLORY...Saint Eudocimus, tone 1:

<u>How</u> can we not wonder at your goodness and <u>wis</u>dom? How can we fail to praise your an<u>gel</u>ic life, your pure <u>thoughts</u>, meekness, humility and inner <u>still</u>ness, your constant almsgiving, O <u>ven</u>erable Eu<u>do</u>cimus? For <u>you</u> were adorned with all the virtues, O <u>bless</u>ed one.// Therefore, ineffable joy and the Kingdom of Heaven a<u>wait</u> you. *NOW AND EVER...the Resurrection Dogmatikon in tone 6*
