### SUNDAY, AUGUST 14, 2022 9th Sunday after Pentecost Forefeast of the Dormition Prophet Micah

The Prophet Micah, the sixth of the Twelve Minor Prophets, was descended from the Tribe of Judah and was a native of the city of Moresheth, to the south of Jerusalem. His prophetic service began around the year 778 before Christ and continued for almost 50 years under the kings of Judah: Jotham, Ahaz, and Righteous Hezekiah (721-691 B.C., August 28).

He was a contemporary of the Prophet Isaiah. His denunciations and predictions were in regard to the separate kingdoms of Judah and Israel. He foresaw the misfortunes threatening the kingdom of Israel before its destruction, and the sufferings of Judah during the incursions under the Assyrian emperor Sennacherib.

To him belongs a prophecy about the birth of the Savior of the world: "And thou, Bethlehem, house of Ephratha, art too few in number to be reckoned with the thousands of Judah; yet out of thee shall come forth to Me, one who is to be a ruler in Israel, and His goings forth were from the beginning, even from eternity" (Mic. 5: 2). From the words of the Prophet Jeremiah (Jer. 26: 18-19), the Jews evidently were afraid to kill the Prophet Micah. His relics were discovered in the fourth century after the Birth of Christ at Baraphsatia, through a revelation to the Bishop of Eleutheropolis, Zeuinos

Come now and gather on the <u>Pre</u>feast, company of priests, kings and <u>rul</u>ers, to<u>geth</u>er with the ranks of <u>virg</u>ins! Assemble together, all people, sending up <u>fun</u>eral songs! For tomorrow the Queen of all, bound for the <u>man</u>sions of <u>heaven</u>,// will commit her soul into the hands of her Son.

## **Prophet Micah, tone 4:**

You show mosted exalted divine <u>know</u>ledge, proclaiming the high and lofty <u>mountain</u>: the <u>preaching</u> of the Savior that would <u>be</u> revealed at the top of the <u>mountains</u>, where the nations hasten with faith and <u>turn</u> with <u>fer</u>vor to learn the <u>ways</u> of the Lord.// They are saved with eternal salvation.

O Micah, wondrous among the <u>Proph</u>ets, with a divinely in<u>spired</u> tongue, you <u>prophesied</u> the Prince Whose coming is indeed from ever<u>last-</u> ing: He issues forth as the Shepherd of His <u>peo</u>ple coming <u>forth</u> from <u>Beth</u>lehem. Now you behold thy <u>proph</u>ecy fulfilled,// and with divine wisdom we glorify Him about <u>Whom</u> you spoke.

Standing before the throne of God, O most honored <u>Proph</u>et, given joy and beholding <u>glo</u>ry, you de<u>light</u> in divine food, filled with spiritual <u>glad</u>ness and joy. Now look down upon those who celebrate your <u>mem</u>ory,// delivering them from dangers by your un<u>ceasing</u> prayers!

### Glory ... Forefeast, tone 4:

O pure and most holy <u>Virgin</u>, the multitude of angels in heaven and <u>men</u> on earth extol and venerate your <u>falling</u> asleep, for you are the Mother of Christ our God and Creator of all. Never cease to intercede with <u>Him</u> on <u>our</u> behalf, for, next to God, we have put our <u>hope</u> in you,// O greatly-honored, unwedded Theotokos!
