SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 25, 2022 15th Sunday after Pentecost Repose of Ven. Sergius, Abbot and Wonderworker of Rádonezh and All Russia

Sergius was a great ascetic and light of the Russian Church. He was born in 1313 A.D., in Rostov, of devout parents, Cyril and Maria. After his parents' deaths, Bartholomew--for that was his baptismal name--became a monk, and founded the Monastery of the Holy Trinity in the forests of Radonezh. As a quiet and gentle servant of God, he knew only labor and prayer. Because of the purity of his heart he was made worthy of the gift of miracle-working, even resurrecting the dead in the name of Christ. The Holy Theotokos appeared to him many times. Princes and bishops came to him for advice. He blessed Prince Dimitri Donskoy, and foretold his victory in the battle for the liberation of Russia from the Tartars. He saw into the hearts of men as well as future events. His monastery was full of monks, even during his lifetime and, century after century, has been one of the most important centers of spiritual life and God's miracles. St. Sergius entered into rest in the year 1392 A.D. Following his repose, he appeared many times to various people.

Who can tell of your labors and pains, O holy <u>Fa</u>ther? What tongue can speak of your <u>rig</u>orous life, your vigils and <u>ab</u>stinence from food, your sleeping upon the <u>cold</u> earth, your purity of <u>body</u> and soul, the complete silence of your <u>lips</u> and mind, your true humility, unceasing prayers and discerning judgment, the poverty of your ap<u>par</u>el, and your never-failing re<u>mem</u>brance of death?// Our holy Father Sergius, pray for the sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls!

O holy Father Sergius,

you were revealed to be a physician of our souls and <u>bod</u>ies,

a fount of <u>heal</u>ing for the sick.

Adorned with the gift of prophecy, you spoke of <u>fu</u>ture things.

By your prayer, O saint, you armed the prince fighting for his <u>fath</u>erland

against the boastful barbarians,//

and they fell, struck like the people of <u>Amalek</u>.

O holy Sergius, <u>wise</u> in God, you forsook the <u>glo</u>ry of the world, living in the <u>wil</u>derness and the hills. You were the pure dwelling-place of the Holy <u>Trin</u>ity, by Whose strength you raised up many holy <u>churches</u> and built a fortress for the salvation of those living the as<u>cet</u>ic life. Christ our God, Whom you de<u>sired</u> from your youth, dwelt in you, O <u>bless</u>ed one.// Entreat Him, O holy Father Sergius, to <u>save</u> our souls!

St. Sergius , tone 2:

Enduring with fortitude the things of the <u>present</u>, rejoicing in the promise for the <u>fu</u>ture, holy <u>Sergius</u>, you <u>said</u> to all: "If we now strive unrewarded, we still have hope for e<u>ter</u>nal life. Our afflictions are grievous, but <u>Par</u>adise is sweet. Our <u>labors</u> are painful, but our undertaking is ever<u>lasting</u>. Therefore do not be slothful, O <u>people</u> who fast! Let us endure but a little that we may be crowned with incor<u>rup</u>tion// by Christ our God, the <u>Sav</u>ior of our souls!"

Looking upon afflictions as <u>pleasure</u>, walking along the straight and <u>nar</u>row way, most blessed <u>Sergius</u>, you said to your disciples: "Do not fear the struggle of <u>ab</u>stinence, by which we may escape the fearful <u>tor</u>ments of hell! Let our <u>hands</u> be clasped in prayer, that we may reach <u>out</u> to God! Let our feet be established to stand be<u>fore</u> Him in prayer! Let us not spare the corruptible <u>nature</u>! Let us sur<u>ren</u>der ourselves <u>will</u>ingly to the fight,// that we may be crowned with triumph by <u>Christ</u> our God!"

Glory ... St. Sergius, tone 6:

You have kept the image of God with<u>in</u> you unharmed, and by fasting you set your mind above pernicious <u>passion</u>. You rose to the Master's divine image as far as man is <u>able</u>, having restrained your <u>na</u>ture. You strove to make the lower part obey the <u>high</u>er, so that the spirit would <u>rule</u> the flesh. Therefore you have been shown to be the summit of those living the <u>ascetic</u> life, a dweller of the <u>wild</u>erness, a trainer of those who <u>run</u> the good race, a renowned example of <u>vir</u>tue. O Sergius, our <u>fa</u>ther, now in the heavens you behold in all purity the Holy <u>Trin</u>ity,// while you pray on behalf of those who honor you in <u>faith</u> and love.

OLD TESTAMENT READINGS:

Proverbs (from 10, 3, 8). The memory of the righteous is with praise and the blessing of the Lord is upon his head. Blessed is the man who has found wisdom and the mortal who has understanding. For it is better to purchase her than treasuries of gold and silver. She is more precious than precious stones and all that is precious is unworthy of her. For length of days and years of life are in her right hand; and in her left hand are riches and glory. Out of her mouth proceeds righteousness and she bears law and mercy upon her tongue. Hear me, O child, for I will speak noble things. Blessed is the man who keeps my ways, for my ways are the ways of life, and in them is prepared favor from the Lord. Therefore, I pray thee, and utter my voice to the sons of men: For I, wisdom, have dwelt with counsel and knowledge and I have called upon understanding. Counsel and safety are mine, understanding and strength are mine. I love those who love me and those seeking me shall find grace. Understand craftiness, O you who are simple, and imbibe knowledge, you who are untaught. Hear me again, for I will speak noble things: I will open my mouth and from my lips shall come what is right. For my throat shall meditate truth; false lips are an abomination before me. All the words of my mouth are righteous; there is nothing in them that is twisted or perverse. They are all straight to him who understands and right to those who find knowledge. I shall instruct you in truth, so that your hope will be in the Lord and you shall be filled with the Spirit.

Proverbs 10:31-11:12. The mouth of the righteous brings forth wisdom, but the perverse tongue will be cut out. The lips of the righteous know what is acceptable, but the mouth of the wicked what is perverse. Dishonest scales are an abomination to the Lord, but a just weight is His delight. When pride comes, then comes shame; but with the humble is wisdom. The integrity of the upright will guide them, but the perversity of the unfaithful will destroy them. Riches do not profit in the day of wrath, but righteousness delivers from death. The righteousness of the blameless will direct his way aright, but the wicked will fall by his own wickedness. The righteousness of the upright will deliver them, but the unfaithful will be caught by their lust. When a

wicked man dies, his expectation will perish, and the hope of the unjust perishes. The righteous is delivered from trouble, and it comes to the wicked instead. The hypocrite with his mouth destroys his neighbor, but through knowledge the righteous will be delivered. When it goes well with the righteous, the city rejoices; and when the wicked perish, there is jubilation. By the blessing of the upright the city is exalted, but it is overthrown by the mouth of the wicked. He who is devoid of wisdom despises his neighbor, but a man of understanding holds his peace.

Wisdom of Solomon 3:1-9. But the souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and no torment will ever touch them. In the eyes of the foolish they seemed to have died, and their departure was thought to be affliction, and their going from us to be their destruction; but they are at peace. For though in the sight of men they were punished, their hope is full of immortality. Having been disciplined a little, they will receive great good, because God tested them and found them worthy of himself; like gold in the furnace he tried them, and like a sacrificial burnt offering he accepted them. In the time of their visitation they will shine forth, and will run like sparks through the stubble. They will govern nations and rule over peoples, and the Lord will reign over them for ever. Those who trust in him will understand truth, and the faithful will abide with him in love, because grace and mercy are upon his elect, and he watches over his holy ones.

St. Sergius, tone 4:

A <u>zeal</u>ot of good deeds and a true warrior of <u>Christ</u> our God, you struggled greatly against the passions in this <u>pass</u>ing life; in songs and vigils and fasting you were an image and example to your dis<u>ci</u>ples, thus the most Holy Spirit <u>lived</u> within you, and you were made beautiful by His <u>work</u>ing. Since you have great boldness before the Holy <u>Trin</u>ity, remember the flock which you have wisely <u>gath</u>ered,// and do not forget to visit your children as you promised, venerable Sergius, our <u>fa</u>ther!

Resurrectional dismissal theotokion, tone 4:

The mystery of all eternity, unknown even by <u>Ang</u>els,

through you, Theotokos, is revealed to <u>those</u> on earth: God incarnate by union without con<u>fu</u>sion. He voluntarily accepted the <u>Cross</u> for us, by which He resurrected the first-cre<u>a</u>ted man,// saving our <u>souls</u> from death.
