#### NOVEMBER 6, 2022 SAINT PAUL THE CONFESSOR, ARCHBISHOP OF CONSTANTINOPLE

Saint Paul the Confessor, Archbishop of Constantinople, was chosen to the patriarchal throne after the death of Patriarch Alexander (+ 340), when the Arian heresy had again flared up. Many of the Arians were present at the Council which selected the new Archbishop of Constantinople. They revolted in opposition to the choice of St. Paul, but the Orthodox at the Council were in the majority. The emperor Constantius, ruling over the Eastern half of the Roman Empire, was an Arian. He was not in Constantinople for the election of the Archbishop, and so it took place without his consent. Upon his return, he convened a council which illegally deposed St. Paul, and the emperor banished him from the capital. In place of the saint they elevated Eusebius of Nicomedia, an impious heretic. Archbishop Paul withdrew to Rome, where other Orthodox bishops were also banished by Eusebius.

Eusebius did not rule the Church of Constantinople for long. When he died, St. Paul returned to Constantinople, and was greeted by his flock with love. But Constantius exiled the saint a second time, and so he returned to Rome. The Western emperor Constans wrote a harsh letter to his Eastern co-ruler, which he sent to Constantinople along with the holy exiled archpastor. The threats worked, and St. Paul was reinstated upon the archepiscopal throne.

But soon the pious emperor Constans, a defender of the Orthodox, was treacherously murdered during a palace coup. They again banished St. Paul from Constantinople and this time sent him off in exile to Armenia, to the city of Cucusus, where he endured a martyr's death. When the Archbishop was celebrating the Divine Liturgy, Arians rushed upon him by force and strangled him with his own omophorion. This occurred in the year 350. In 381, the holy Emperor Theodosius the Great solemnly transferred the relics of St. Paul the Confessor from Cucusus to Constantinople. In 1326, the relics of St. Paul were transferred to Venice.

St. Athanasius the Great, a contemporary of St. Paul, writes briefly about his exiles, "St. Paul the first time was sent by Constantine to Pontus, the second time he was fettered with chains by Constantius, and then he was locked up in Mesopotamian Syngara and from there moved to Emesus, and the fourth time to Cappadocian Cucusus in the Taurian wilderness."

Aflame with his zeal, you are a <u>cham</u>pion of <u>Or</u>thodoxy.// Now you are glorified with him in the heavenly <u>man</u>sions.

You strangled the ungodly Arius and the impious Mace<u>do</u>nius with the strong cords of your <u>doc</u>trines. But with the right <u>word</u> of your <u>teaching</u> you confirmed the multitude of the <u>Or</u>thodox, O blessed <u>leader in sacred things</u>. Therefore, the Lover of mankind accepted your brilliant con<u>fession</u>,// revealing you to be a sharer in His Kingdom.

You finished the course and kept the faith, O blessed <u>Hi</u>erarch. Christ has crowned you with a bright wreath of <u>right</u>eousness, and <u>glo</u>rified your confession, O truly <u>won</u>drous Paul. Therefore, having received the heavenly in<u>her</u>itance,// pray to the Savior for those who sing <u>praises</u> to you.

Most blessed Paul, the namesake of con<u>fes</u>sion, you are the intercessor for those who <u>praise</u> you in faith; de<u>liv</u>er us from all danger and <u>ev</u>ery sin, and from the storm of the passions and from <u>tyr</u>anny, for you are an invincible <u>mar</u>tyr, O <u>Fa</u>ther, and a rightly-accepted <u>bish</u>op.// You have acquired boldness before <u>Christ</u> our God! *GLORY... for the saint, tone 1:*  <u>Clothed</u> in the vestments of a bishop, venerable <u>Fa</u>ther, you emulated your namesake, O Paul.

You en<u>dured</u> persecution and tribu<u>la</u>tions; by constant toil you overthrew the blasphemous <u>teachings</u> of <u>A</u>rius. You <u>suffered</u> for the unoriginate and consubstantial <u>Trin</u>ity; you cast down the impious Macedonius who fought against the <u>Spir</u>it. Having <u>given</u> a clear explanation of the Orthodox <u>Faith</u> to all, you abide with the imma<u>terial angels.</u>//

Together with them, now pray that our souls may be saved.
