SUNDAY, JANUARY 29, 2023 SUNDAY OF ZACCHAEUS Translation of the Relics of Hieromartyr Ignatius the Godbearer

The Transfer of the Relics of the Hieromartyr Ignatius the God-Bearer: (See December 20). After the holy hieromartyr Ignatius was thrown to the lions in the year 107 on the orders of the emperor Trajan, Christians gathered up his bones and preserved them at Rome. Later, in the year 108, the saint's relics were collected and buried outside the gate of Daphne at Antioch. A second transfer, to the city of Antioch itself, took place in the year 438. After the capture of Antioch by the Persians, the relics of the Hieromartyr Ignatius were returned to Rome and placed into the church of the holy Hieromartyr Clement in the year 540 (in 637, according to other sources). Saint Ignatius introduced antiphonal singing into Church services. He has left us seven archpastoral epistles in which he provided instructions on faith, love and good works. He also urged his flock to preserve the unity of the faith and to beware of heretics. He encouraged people to honor and obey their bishops, "We should regard the bishop as we would the Lord Himself." (To the Ephesians 6) In his Letter to Polycarp, Saint Ignatius writes: "Listen to the bishop, if you want God to listen to you... let your baptism be your shield, your faith a helmet, your charity a spear, your patience, like full armor." (Compare Eph. 6:14-17 and the Wisdom of Solomon 5:17-20. Also The Ladder 4:2)

You were the last successor of John the Theo<u>log</u>ian and you followed in his steps, O I<u>gna</u>tius. You <u>rose</u> from the east but ap<u>peared</u> in the west, thus you il<u>lumined</u> all with the lightning flashes of godly preaching. There you departed from the world, and shone out to God, O most-wise <u>Mar</u>tyr, // crowned with the <u>splen</u>dor of grace.

O most-wise God-bearer, Ig<u>na</u>tius, your relics were given to your city in a <u>ho</u>ly way. They were <u>hal</u>lowed in splendor by your <u>suf</u>fering, thus illumining us with <u>grace</u> by their return. They have become the <u>cause</u> of our <u>so</u>lemn feast; they fill with gladness those in<u>spired</u> by God and delight with sweet <u>frag</u>rance // those who honor you with de<u>vo</u>tion.

Before, you shone from the east upon the <u>lands</u> of the west more brightly than the <u>morning star</u>. <u>Now</u>, in the return of your divine <u>relics</u>, you have spread beams of light upon the earth from the <u>evening sky</u>. You entreat Christ to deliver from cor<u>rup</u>tion and mis<u>for</u>tune // those who celebrate your most honored <u>mem</u>ory with faith.

GLORY... Martyr, tone 8:

Em<u>brac</u>ing Christ as your love, O God-bearer Ignatius, you received the reward of being a priest of Christ's <u>Gos</u>pel, even unto the <u>shed</u>ding of <u>your</u> blood. Thus, becoming the immortal <u>Sow</u>er's wheat, ground by the teeth of <u>wild</u> beasts, you offered yourself as a <u>loaf</u> of sweet <u>bread</u> to Christ.// O blessed passion-bearer, never cease to <u>pray</u> for us!

GLORY...for the Martyr, tone 1: O <u>bless</u>ed Ignatius, your soul was strong and <u>hard</u> as a stone. You <u>cried</u> to your beloved Christ with great <u>long</u>ing: "It is not a material fire <u>burn</u>ing with<u>in</u> me, but the <u>voice</u> of the living water dwelling with<u>in</u> my heart, continually crying: 'Come to the <u>Fa</u>ther!'" <u>There</u>fore in your desire to <u>be</u> with Christ, inflamed with the <u>Holy Spirit</u>, you <u>urged</u> the beasts to speedily take you <u>from</u> this world.// Never cease to pray for the sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls!

NOW AND EVER...Resurrectional Theotokion in tone 1:

Be<u>hold</u>, Isaiah's <u>proph</u>ecy is fulfilled, for the Virgin gave birth, yet remained a <u>Virgin!</u> <u>God</u> was born, and so nature was re<u>stored</u> anew. Do not despise the entreaties of your <u>ser</u>vants, O <u>Moth</u>er of God! We <u>off</u>er them to you in your <u>tem</u>ple. Since you carried in your arms the com<u>pas</u>sionate One, have com<u>pas</u>sion on your <u>ser</u>vants,// and pray that our <u>souls</u> may be saved!

TROPARIA

Resurrection, tone 8

You descended <u>from</u> on <u>high</u>, O <u>Mer</u>ciful One! You accepted the <u>three</u> day <u>bur</u>ial to free us from our <u>suff</u>erings!// O Lord, our <u>Life</u> and Resur<u>rec</u>tion, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

Saint Ignatius, tone 4

By sharing in the ways of the A<u>post</u>les, you became a suc<u>ces</u>sor to their throne. Through the practice of virtue, you found the way to divine contemplation, O in<u>spired</u> one of God; by teaching the word of truth without error, you defended the Faith, even to the <u>shed</u>ding of your blood.// O Hieromartyr Ignatius, entreat Christ God to save our souls!

Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion, tone 4

The mystery of all e<u>ter</u>nity, unknown even by <u>Ang</u>els, through you, Theotokos, is revealed to <u>those</u> on earth: God incarnate by union without con<u>fu</u>sion. He voluntarily accepted the <u>Cross</u> for us, by which He resurrected the first-cre<u>a</u>ted man,// saving our <u>souls</u> from death.

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
