SUNDAY, FEBRUARY, 26, 2023 THE EXPULSION OF ADAM FROM PARADISE CHEESEFARE SUNDAY

As we begin the Great Fast, the Church reminds us of Adam's expulsion from Paradise. God commanded Adam to fast (Gen. 2:16), but he did not obey. Because of their disobedience, Adam and Eve were cast out of Eden and lost the life of blessedness, knowledge of God, and communion with Him, for which they were created. Both they and their descendents became heirs of death and corruption.

Let us consider the benefits of fasting, the consequences of disobedience, and recall our fallen state. Today we are invited to cleanse ourselves of evil through fasting and obedience to God. Our fasting should not be a negative thing, a mere abstention from certain foods. It is an opportunity to free ourselves from the sinful desires and urges of our fallen nature, and to nourish our souls with prayer, repentance, to participate in church services, and partake of the life-giving Mysteries of Christ.

At Forgiveness Vespers we sing: "Let us begin the time of fasting in light, preparing ourselves for spiritual efforts. Let us purify our soul, let us purify our body. As we abstain from food, let us abstain from all passion and enjoy the virtues of the spirit...."

GREAT VESPERS

<u>LORD I CALL</u>: Six stikhera of the Resurrection in tone 4 (spiral bound vespers book) followed by four from the Triodion Triodion, tone 6:

The Lord took a handful of <u>dust</u> from the earth. He breathed into it, and created me, a <u>living</u> man! He made me lord and master of <u>all</u> things on earth; Truly I enjoyed the life of the <u>angels</u>! But Satan the deceiver, in the guise of a serpent, <u>tempted</u> me: I ate the forbidden fruit, and forfeited the <u>glory</u> of God. Now I have been delivered to the <u>earth</u> through death.// O my compassionate Lord, call me back to <u>Eden</u>!

When the enemy tempted me,

I disobeyed Your command, O Lord.

I exchanged the glory of my immortal body for shame and <u>nakedness</u>.

Now I must wear garments of skins and fig-leaves;

I am condemned to eat the bread of bitter hardship by the <u>sweat</u> of my brow.

The earth is cursed, and brings forth thorns and <u>husks</u> for me. O Lord, you took flesh from the Virgin in the <u>fullness</u> of time:// Call me back and restore me to <u>Eden</u>!

O Paradise, garden of delight and <u>beauty</u>, Dwelling-place made <u>perfect</u> by God, Unending gladness and e<u>ternal</u> joy, The hope of the Prophets and the <u>home</u> of the Saints, By the music of your rustling leaves beseech the <u>Creator</u> of all To open to me the gates which my <u>sins</u> have closed, That I may partake of the tree of <u>life</u> and grace// Which was given to me in the beginning.

Adam was exiled from Paradise through diso<u>be</u>dience; he was driven from eternal bliss, deceived by the <u>words</u> of Eve; he sat naked and weeping before the gates of <u>Paradise</u>. Let us hasten to enter the season of <u>fast</u>ing; let us carefully obey the <u>Gos</u>pel commands, that we may be made acceptable to <u>Christ</u> our God,// and regain our home in <u>E</u>den!

GLORY...Triodion, tone 6:

Adam sat before the gates of <u>Eden</u>, Bewailing his nakedness and <u>crying</u> out: Woe to me! I have listened to <u>wicked</u> deceit: I have lost my glory, and now am <u>driven</u> away! Woe to me! My open-mindedness has left me <u>naked</u> and confused! No longer will I enjoy your delights, O <u>Paradise</u>; No longer can I see my Lord, My God and Cre<u>ator</u>. He formed me from dust, and now to the <u>dust</u> I return! I beg You, O Com<u>passionate</u> Lord:// Have mercy on me, who has <u>fallen</u>!

NOW AND EVER... the Dogmatikon in tone 4 (spiral bound vespers book)

<u>APOSTICHA</u>: All stikhera of the Resurrection in tone 4 (spiral bound Vespers book)

GLORY... Triodion, tone 6:Adam ate the forbidden fruit and was driven from paradise.He sat outside, weeping bitterly:Woe to me! What will become of me, a worthless man?I disobeyed one command of my Master, and lost every good thing!O Holy Paradise, planted for me by GodAnd closed by the weakness of Eve,Grant that I may once again gaze on the flowers of your gardens!The Savior said to him:I do not wish the death of my creation!I desire that all should be savedAnd come to the knowledge of the truth,//For he who comes to me I shall never cast out!

NOW AND EVER... Resurrection Theotokion, tone 6:

My Maker and Redeemer, <u>Christ</u> the Lord, was born of you, O most pure <u>Virgin</u>. By accepting my nature, He freed Adam from his <u>an</u>cient curse. Unceasingly we magnify you as the <u>Mother of God!</u> Rejoice, O ce<u>les</u>tial Joy! Rejoice, O <u>La</u>dy:// the Protection, Intercession and Sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls!

TROPARIA

Resurrection, tone 4

When the women disciples of the Lord learned from the angel the joyous message of Your Resur<u>rec</u>tion, they cast away the an<u>ces</u>tral curse and elatedly told the a<u>pos</u>tles: "<u>Death</u> is overthrown! Christ God is <u>ris</u>en,// granting the world great <u>mer</u>cy!"

Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion, tone 4

The mystery of all e<u>ter</u>nity, unknown even by <u>Ang</u>els, through you, Theotokos, is revealed to <u>those</u> on earth: God incarnate by union without con<u>fu</u>sion. He voluntarily accepted the <u>Cross</u> for us, by which He resurrected the first-cre<u>a</u>ted man,// saving our <u>souls</u> from death.

FOREGIVENESS VESPERS – Sunday after Liturgy

<u>LORD I CALL:</u> Four penitential stikhera, followed by three from the Triodion

Penitential, tone 4:

Lord, I long to wash away with tears the record of <u>all</u> my sins, and to spend the remaining <u>days</u> of my life <u>pleasing</u> You through repentance, but the Enemy continually deceives me. He wages <u>war</u> against my soul.// Save me before I perish completely, O Lord!

Who, when caught in a storm, if he runs to this haven is not saved?

Or who that is sick, if he runs to this healing, is <u>not</u> made whole? O Cre<u>a</u>tor of all and Phy<u>si</u>cian of the sick,// Save me before I perish com<u>plete</u>ly, O Lord!

Wash me in my tears, O <u>Sav</u>ior, for I am defiled by <u>many</u> sins! <u>There</u>fore I fall be<u>fore</u> You:// I have sinned; have mercy on <u>me</u>, O God!

I, a sheep of Your <u>rational flock</u>, flee for refuge to You, the Good <u>Shep</u>herd. O <u>God</u>, I have <u>gone</u> astray;// seek me, and have <u>mer</u>cy on me!

Triodion, tone 2:

Let us humble the flesh by <u>ab</u>stinence, as we follow the divine path of pure <u>fasting!</u> With <u>prayers</u> and tears let us seek the Lord, Who <u>saves</u> us! Let us put an end to anger, <u>cry</u>ing out: "Save us for we have sinned against You! <u>Save</u> us, O Christ our King, as You saved the men of <u>Nin</u>eveh,// and make us partakers of Your heavenly Kingdom, O com<u>pas</u>sionate One!"

When I think of my <u>deeds</u>, O Lord, I am <u>filled</u> with despair, and <u>know</u> that I am worthy of every <u>tor</u>ment. I have despised Your commandments, O <u>Sav</u>ior. I have spent my life as a <u>prodigal</u>. I <u>pray</u> to You, O only <u>mer</u>ciful One: "Cleanse me by re<u>pent</u>ance, enlighten me through prayers and <u>fasting</u>,// and despise me not, O most gracious Bene<u>fac</u>tor of all!"

Tone 2: Let us begin the <u>fast</u> with joy! Let us prepare ourselves for spiritual <u>efforts</u>! Let us <u>cleanse</u> our soul and <u>cleanse</u> our flesh! Let us abstain from every passion as we ab<u>stain</u> from food! Let us rejoice in virtues of the Spirit and ful<u>fill</u> them in love, that we all may <u>see</u> the Passion of <u>Christ</u> our God,// and rejoice in spirit at the holy <u>Pa</u>scha!

Glory...now & ever... Theotokion, tone 4: As your supplication before God is endless and your entreaty to Him is continual, I beseech you, O all-pure one: "Subdue the temptations and still the upheavals of my wretched soul; calm my distressed heart,// and bring grace to my mind, that I may fittingly <u>glo</u>rify you!"

Great Prokeimenon, tone 8:

Turn not away Your face from Your child, for I am afflicted: / hear me speedily, draw near unto my soul, and deliver it!

<u>APOSTICHA</u>: Triodion, tone 4:

Your grace hath shone <u>forth</u>, O Lord: the grace which il<u>lu</u>mines our soul. <u>This</u> is the acceptable time! This is the time of repentance! Let us lay aside the works of darkness and put on the <u>armor</u> of light, that passing through the Fast as through a <u>great</u> sea we may reach the Resurrection on the <u>third</u> day// of our Lord Jesus Christ, the <u>Sav</u>ior of our souls.

You are <u>glo</u>rified

in the memory of Your saints, O <u>Christ</u> God.// At their supplications, send down on us Your great <u>mer</u>cy!

Glory... now & ever... Triodion, tone 4:

The angelic hosts glorify you, O <u>Mother of God</u>, for you gave <u>birth</u> to God, co-e<u>ter</u>nal with the Father and the <u>Spir</u>it, Who, by His own desire, created the angelic hosts out of <u>nothing</u>. Beseech Him to deliver from corruption and to en<u>light</u>en// the souls of those who rightly praise you, O most <u>pure</u> one!

LENTEN TROPARIA, tone 8:

Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, Mary, full of grace: the <u>Lord</u> is with you. Blessed are <u>you</u> among women, and blessed is the Fruit of your <u>womb</u>;// for you have borne the <u>Sav</u>ior of our souls.

O <u>Bap</u>tiser of Christ, remember us <u>all</u>, that we may be de<u>liv</u>ered from our in<u>iq</u>uities;// for to you is given grace to inter<u>cede</u> for us!

Inter<u>cede</u> for us, O holy Apostles and all the <u>saints</u>, that we may be de<u>liv</u>ered from perils and <u>sor</u>rows;// for we have acquired you as fervent intercessors before the <u>Sav</u>ior!

Be<u>neath</u> your compassion we take refuge, O Theo<u>to</u>kos. Do not de<u>spise</u> our supplications in ad<u>ver</u>sity,// but deliver us from perils, O only pure and only <u>bless</u>ed one!

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
