America's tragically high incarceration rate (2.3 million) means that—chances are—more than one parishioner in your church has been touched by a person serving time in prison.

OCPM introduces prisoners to the fullness of the Orthodox Faith. And we help Orthodox Christians who have been convicted of crimes to return to the Orthodox faith and find healing and reconciliation. But we can't do this work without the support of our parishes. As the national prison ministry of the Orthodox Church, we are entirely funded through parish and individual support.

Please help us fulfill the commandment of our Lord to visit Him in prison (Matthew 25:36) by participating in this vital day of awareness.

Orthodox Christian Prison Ministry (OCPM) is an agency of the Assembly of Canonical Orthodox Bishops of the United States. For Orthodox Christians who have been arrested for crimes, OCPM helps them return to the Faith, offering forgiveness and reconciliation with Christ. For both Orthodox and non-Orthodox alike, OCPM provides spiritual care, enabling prisoners to find hope and purpose in their lives.

¹⁰ Therefore, brethren, do all that you can to make your calling and election assured. Indeed, if you do these things, you will never stumble. ¹¹ Thus, you will be richly granted the entrance into the eternal Kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

¹² Therefore, I will not be negligent to remind you of these things although you [already] know them and are established in the truth which you now have. 13 I think it right, as long as I am in this tent, to stir you up by reminding you [of these things]. 14 I know that I shall lay aside my tent very quickly, even as our Lord Jesus Christ made clear to me. ¹⁵ And so, I will make every effort [to ensure] that you will always be able to remember these things, even after my departure. ¹⁶ Certainly, we did not depend on cleverly invented fables when we told you about the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ; we were eyewitnesses of his majesty! 17 For he received from God the Father honor and glory when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." 18 We heard this voice come out of heaven when we were with him on the holy mountain.

17 Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter, James, and John his brother, and he brought them up into a high mountain by themselves. ² [There], he was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and his garments became as white as the light. ³ And behold, Moses and Elias (Elijah) appeared to them, talking with him.

⁴ Peter then said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here! If you want, let us make three tents here: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elias (Elijah)."

⁵ While Peter was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them. And behold, a voice came out of the cloud, saying, "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased. Listen to him."

⁶ When the disciples heard it, they fell on their faces and were very afraid. ⁷ Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Get up, and do not be afraid." ⁸ Lifting up their eyes, they saw no one, except Jesus alone. ⁹ As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus gave them this order: "Do not tell anyone what you saw, until the Son of Man has risen again from the dead."

Orthodox Christian Prison Ministry (OCPM) is the national prison ministry of the Orthodox Church. OCPM corresponds with thousands of prisoners across the country and provides spiritual books, Bibles, icons, and catechism courses. OCPM trains Orthodox priests and laypeople to enter prisons and minister to prisoners.

Our Life in Ghrist—The Blessing of Fruit on Transfiguration

The blessing of fruits i.e., grapes, apples, etc., is a very beautiful custom of our Holy Church. The practice signifies the final transfiguration of all things in Christ our Savior. "It signifies the ultimate flowering and fruitfulness of all creation in the Paradise of God's Kingdom of Life where all will be transformed by the Glory of the Lord".

This is an early Christian tradition. The first week of August, on the sixth of August, the farmers used to gather the first fruits of their summer harvest (grapes, figs, etc.) and to offer thanks to God and offer them to the Church to be blessed and then to



give them to the faithful present at the Divine Liturgy as a blessing to them. These fruits are called the "beginnings".

In a text from the 7th century ("the laws of the kingdom") by Emperor Constantine Porfirogenitos this tradition is described clearly: "The Emperor of Constantinople gathers the "beginnings" ("aparches") in Chalcedon, where there are many vines, and then he waits for the Patriarch of Constantinople to come on the Holy Day of the Transfiguration of Christ, to bless the fruits and to personally hand out the grapes to the faithful.

This tradition is adhered to in various parts of Greece where they grow grapes.

Saint John Chrysostom wrote: "Plowman receives fruit from the earth not so much for his labor and diligence, as out of the goodness of God Who grows this fruit, because neither is he that plants anything, neither he that waters, but God that gives the increase".

Grapes are brought to church because they are directly connected to the Holy Eucharistic Mystery



(Sacraments); that is why in the prayer for the blessing of grapes the priest says, "Bless, Lord, this new fruit of the vine which reached ripeness because Thou kindly provided god weather, drops of rain and stillness. Let eating this fruit of vine makes us joyful. And give us the honor of offering this fruit to Thee, as the gift of purging of sins, altogether with the Holy Body of Thy Christ.

In Slavic countries apples are blessed this day, due to the climate and scarcity of grapes at this time of the year.
