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
A Word from the Holy Fathers

Teacher of Orthodoxy, piety, & purity! Enlightener of the universe! & divine inspiration to monastics by your teachings we are all enlightened, & by your spiritual music, O all-wise John of Damascus.

St Maximus the Confessor—Tone 8

Champion of Orthodoxy, teacher of purity and of true worship,

enlightener of the universe and the adornment of hierarchs:

all-wise Father Maximus, your teachings have gleamed with light upon all things. Intercede before Christ God to save our souls!

Martyr Neophytus—Tone 4

Your holy martyr Neophýtus, O Lord, through his suffering has received an incorruptible crown from You, our God. For having Your strength, he laid low his adversaries,

and shattered the powerless boldness of demons.

Through his intercessions save our souls!

Today's Worship — Scripture Readings

Epistle — Colossians 1: 12-18

12 May you give thanks to God the Father, who has granted us to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in the light. 13 He has delivered us from the power of darkness, and translated us into the Kingdom of the Son of his love. 14 In him, we have our redemption, the forgiveness of our sins.

15 He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. 16 For in him, all things were created, in the heavens and on earth, things visible and invisible, thrones, dominions, principalities, and powers; all things have been created through him, and for him. 17 He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. 18 He is the head of the body, the Church; [he is] the first cause, the firstborn from the dead, so that in all [things] he might have the first place.

Gospel — Matthew 22: 1-14

22 Jesus now addressed them with another parable, saying: 2 "The Kingdom of Heaven is like a king who planned a wedding feast for his son. 3 He then sent out his slaves to call those who were invited to the wedding feast, but they refused to come. 4 Again, the king sent out other slaves, saying: 'Tell those who are invited, "Behold, I have prepared my dinner! My cattle and my fatted calves have been killed and everything is ready. Come to the wedding feast!" ' 5 But those who were invited made light of it and went off, one to his own farm, another to his merchandise, 6 and the others seized the king's slaves, treated them shamefully, and killed them. 7 But when the king heard about it, he was furious. He sent out his soldiers to destroy those murderers and to burn their city. 8 Then the king said to his servants, 'The wedding is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy. 9 Go therefore to the crossroads of the highways, and as many people as you may find, invite to the wedding feast.' 10 Those slaves went out into the highways and gathered as many people as they could find, both good and bad. Thus, the wedding [hall] was filled with guests. 11 But when the king came in to see the guests, he saw a man who was not wearing a wedding garment. 12 He asked him, 'Friend, how did you come in here, not wearing a wedding garment?' And the man was speechless. 13 Then the king said to the servants, 'Bind him hand and foot, take him away, and throw him into the outer darkness where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth.' 14 Indeed, many are called, but few are chosen!"
