Gospel — 1 Corinthians 16: 13-24

¹³ Watch! Stand firm in the faith! Be courageous!
Be strong!
¹⁴ Let all that you do be done in love.

¹⁵ Now I beg you, brethren (you know the house of Stephanas, that it is the first fruits of Achaia, and that they have devoted themselves to serve the saints), ¹⁶ that you also be in service to people like this, and to everyone who helps in the work and labors. ¹⁷ I rejoice at the coming of Stephanas, Fortunatus, and Achaicus; for what was lacking on your part, they supplied. ¹⁸ They refreshed my spirit and yours; show therefore your appreciation to such people.

¹⁹ The Churches of Asia greet you. Aquila and Priscilla greet you much in the Lord, together with the Church that is in their house. ²⁰ All the brethren greet you. Greet one another with a holy kiss!

²¹ This greeting is by me, Paul, with my own hand. ²² If anyone does not love the Lord Jesus Christ, let him be accursed. Maranatha! ²³ May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with you. ²⁴ My love is with you all in Christ Jesus. Amen.

Gospel — Luke 5: 1-11

5 Now it happened, while the multitude pressed on him and heard the word of God, that he was standing by the lake of Gennesaret. ² He saw two boats standing by the lake, but the fishermen had gone out of them and they were washing their nets. ³ Jesus entered into one of the boats, which was Simon's, and asked him to put out a little from the land. He sat down and taught the multitudes from the boat. ⁴ When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep, and let down your nets for a catch."

⁵ Simon answered him, "Master, we worked all night and took nothing! But at your word, I will let down the net." ⁶ When they had done this, they caught a great multitude of fish, and their net was breaking. ⁷ They beckoned to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. They came and filled both boats, so [much] that they began to sink. ⁸ But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, Lord!" ⁹ He and all who were with him were amazed at their catch of fish; ¹⁰ and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon.

Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid! From now on, you will be catching people alive."

¹¹When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.
