A Word...



Today's Worship — Scripture Readings

Epistle — Galatians 2: 16-20

¹⁶ yet knowing that no one is justified by the works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, we believed in Christ Jesus, so that we might be justified by faith in Christ, and not by the works of the law, because no one will be justified by the works of the law. 17 But if, even though we desired to be justified in Christ, we were found to be sinners, does that mean that Christ is a servant of sin? Certainly not! 18 Indeed, if I build up again those things which I [once] destroyed, I show that I am breaking the law. ¹⁹ For I, through the law, died to the law, so that I might live to God. 20 I have been crucified with Christ, and it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. I now live this life in the flesh, but I live [it] by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and who gave himself up for me.

Epistle — 2 Corinthians 4: 6-15

⁶ seeing that it is God who commanded light to shine out of darkness, and he has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

However, we have this treasure in vessels of clay, so that the amazing power may be from God and not from ourselves. 8 We are pressed on every side, yet [we are] not crushed! We are perplexed, but not to [the point of] despair. 9 We are persecuted yet not forsaken; struck down, yet not destroyed; 10 and we always carry in our bodies the death of the Lord Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body. ¹¹ Indeed, we who live are always delivered to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be revealed in our mortal flesh. 12 And so, death is at work in us, but life in you. ¹³ Still, we have the same spirit of faith, according to what is written, "I believed, and therefore I spoke." We believe, and therefore we also speak; 14 knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus will also raise us with Jesus, and bring us with you into his presence. ¹⁵ All these things are for your benefit, so that as grace is extended to many, this may also cause thanksgiving to be multiplied to the glory of God.

Today's Worship — Scripture Readings

Gospel — Mark 8: 34-9:1

³⁴ Jesus called the multitude to himself with his disciples and said to them, "Whoever wants to come after me, let him deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. 35 Indeed, whoever wants to save his life will lose it; and whoever will lose his life for my sake and for the sake of the Good News will save it. ³⁶ What will it profit if someone gains the whole world and loses his life? 37 Or what will someone give in exchange for his life? ³⁸ Whoever will be ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man also will be ashamed of when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels." 9 Jesus said to them, "Amen, I tell you that there are some standing here who will not taste death until they see the Kingdom of God come with

Epistle — Matthew 22: 35-46

³⁵ One of them, a lawyer, then asked him a question in order to test him. ³⁶ "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the law?"

³⁷ Jesus said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' ³⁸ This is the first and great commandment. ³⁹ The second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' ⁴⁰ The entire law and the prophets depend on these two commandments."

⁴¹ Now while the Pharisees were assembled, Jesus asked them a question, ⁴² saying, "What do you think of the Messiah? Whose son is he?" They answered, "[He is the son] of David."

⁴³ Jesus said to them, "How, then, does David, in the Spirit, call him 'Lord,' saying:

44 'The Lord said to my Lord, sit at my right hand, until I make your enemies a footstool for your feet?'

⁴⁵ If then David calls him Lord, how is he his son?" ⁴⁶ No one was able to answer him a word, and from that day on, no one dared to ask him any more questions.
